From Father Simon



You may have noticed the construction fence around the Benedict Center over the last few days. It is in preparation for the first phase of the work we planned to accomplish through our Capital Campaign '*From Generation to Generation*'.

About four years ago, Monsignor Pollard gathered the members of the three major consultative bodies: Parish Council, Finance Council and School Council, as well as the leaders of various groups and organizations to plan for the long-term future of Queen of All Saints parish. After extensive consultation it was decided that a comprehensive renovation of the Benedict Center as well as a reconfiguration and restoration of the Lemont and Keene buildings would not only serve our current parish needs more effectively, these enhancements would benefit the efforts of all our parish ministries both now and into the future.

In July 2016, we began our Capital Campaign named *From Generation to Generation*. I am grateful to the many who have made financial pledges to help us realize our dreams and plans for the future. The commitment and the prayers of the entire parish community will continue to ensure the success of this project.

As of today, I am happy to announce that we have secured the necessary permits to move forward with our plans. The focus of the upcoming work is threefold:

- i) increase the square footage we use for gathering and learning, as well as retrofit our meeting spaces to be better suited to our meeting and gathering needs;
- ii) upgrade our facilities so that they are ADA-compliant and accessible to all. This will include the replacement of an unusable elevator with one that allows visitors of all abilities access to the Benedict Center and all that it offers;
- iii) improve electrical and plumbing systems, ensure fire safety and upgrade the technological capabilities of our campus.

On Sunday, August 26th, immediately following the 9:30 a.m. Mass, I invite you to join me in praying for God's blessing and protection of our workers as they take on this project and that God who began this good work in and through us may bring it to fulfillment.

Our faith community celebrates the tremendous heritage of continuous support and generosity. It is clear that we are resolutely committed to enhancing and preserving our remarkable campus. I consider it a great honor and duty to continue the mission of "Building the Church Together" here at Queen of All Saints, and beyond, with each and every member of our parish community.

QAS YOUTH MINISTRY

Youth Ministry 2018 Week of Service

A few weeks ago, Queen of All Saints Youth Ministry participated in a week of summer service. The locations all varied, but they were in the Chicagoland area. We had anywhere from 10-15 volunteers each day, all from ages 13-17.

Our week began Monday, July 23 in Orland Park. We first volunteered at The Bridge Teen Center Thrift Store. The thrift store provides 30% of the funds that the teen center needs to function. Our work included sorting clothing by size and gender, and then putting them out in the store for patrons to buy.

Following this, we continued our day at Lake Katherine Nature Center in Palos Hills. We suited up and removed invasive species from a prairie.

On Tuesday, we took the Peterson bus and went to the Well of Mercy. The teens painted the children's playroom, cleaned the backyard, and loaded up trucks with donations. Some of our brave boys helped remove a dead animal from the shed!



A Safe Haven was our destination on Wednesday. A Safe Haven is located at Roosevelt and California in the North Lawndale neighborhood. While it does have a food pantry for the public, it also is a place where the homeless can live and, with help, work to live an independent life. We assisted with packing groceries for their food pantry, and from there our teens worked the door as the welcomers and helped customers carry groceries outside.

On Thursday, we went to the Pacific Garden Mission. We started with hearing a witness statement from one of the residents there who was formerly homeless in Rogers Park. Our first task was to make 400 beds for the residents that evening. From there, we moved to the kitchen to help prepare lunch for residents, and then we served food to them. Once everyone was done eating, we cleaned up and helped the staff prepare the room for dinner.

Our service week ended on Friday with a final day of feeding the homeless. We met at the Mullen's house and packed around 50 bagged lunches to give to any homeless people we saw. Our drivers took us to the Granville Red Line stop and we headed down towards the city. Once we got off the "L", we handed out lunches. All teens were encouraged to ask their recipient for their name, and while this was a bit tough for our teens at first, they felt more comfortable as the day continued.

Overall, this week allowed our teens to see that there are so many different needs right here in our city. In our interactions with others, our teens saw that homelessness can start so close to our own homes. I hope that our volunteers continue to participate in our service work throughout the year.



Stewardship

19th Sunday in Ordinary Time —August 12, 2018

"Get up and eat, else the journey will be too long for you!" 1 KINGS 19:7

Jesus knows that our stewardship journey will be difficult; we are not designed to do it on our own. Fortunately, Jesus gave us the greatest gift of all – the gift of the Eucharist; His own body and blood. When we join our sacrifices with the sacrifice of the Mass, we find the strength and courage to be His joyful disciples.

Stewardship—Understanding our Parish Finances

We rely on three main sources of funds:

Sundays, Holidays, UPP—This is our regular revenue and is by far the largest source of funds to pay for our parish operations. In a sense, this is what “keeps the lights on” by paying for our staff, our routine repairs and maintenance, and the other day to day costs of running the parish.

Long-Term Savings—We are blessed with savings resulting from the generosity of the past, including parish and school endowments. The earnings from these accounts is used to supplement our regular revenue to balance the budget and, on occasion, to pay for extraordinary repairs. We have recently drawn upon those savings deeply to pay for the unanticipated Basilica ceiling project and the bell tower project, and now need to take steps to replenish those savings. **We will need a significant increase in our Sunday collections to pay ourselves back and restore our savings back to a prudent level.**

Capital Campaign—Our *From Generation To Generation* drive will be used to make our older parish buildings more suitable for today’s and tomorrow’s needs, including making better use of space for school needs and for the needs of our increasing numbers of lay ministries.

We believe that a well-informed parish membership deserves an explanation of parish finances. For our financial statement covering 7/1/16 to 6/30/17 see our November 5, 2017 bulletin, available on our parish website at qasparish.org. We will be publishing our 7/1/17 to 6/30/18 financial report later this year.

- Work began as soon as school let out, in asbestos removal work for Phase II (Lemont Building) and Phase III (Keene Building). That work is complete so Phase I (Benedict Center) will now begin and continue through the summer of 2019. **A fence has now been erected around the Benedict Center and construction will begin after Labor Day.**
- We will continue to keep our parish fully informed as the project continues, but in the meantime please consider two thoughts. First, **please keep current on your pledge**, so that we have sufficient cash on hand to make payment on our project as it progresses. Second, please consider whether your circumstances **might permit increasing your pledge**.
- Whatever decision you make, please know that your **parish is deeply grateful for your sacrifice and dedication** to our church, our school and our over 45 ministries through which we serve each other through all phases of our lives. Thank you again!



The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.


