From Fr. Simon



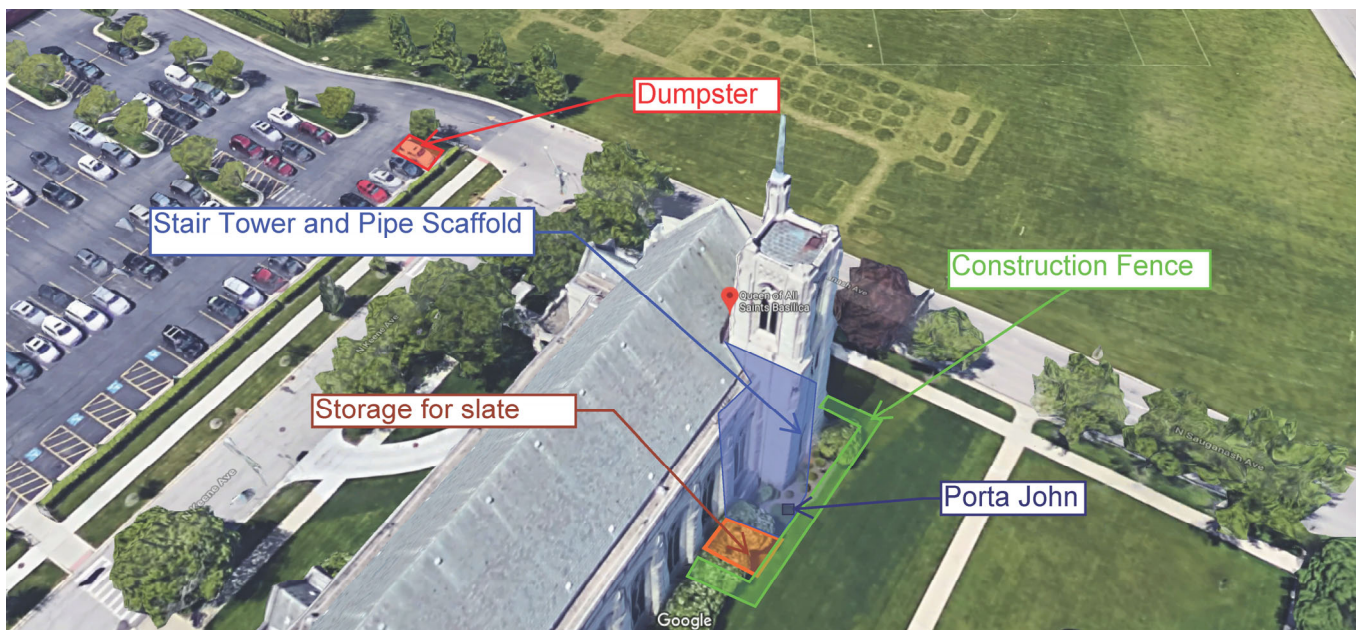
Coming to church this weekend, you may have noticed a fence on one side of the bell tower. Yes, we are starting work on the bell tower. Last October, after a couple of days of heavy rainfall, we noticed water on the northeast wall of the choir loft. Although there was water on both the north and east walls of the choir loft, there was no water on the ceiling tiles. This led us to investigate the source of the leak and in December 2017, a visual inspection revealed that there were cracks in the mortar joints on the west and north sides of the bell tower.

Upon the advice of the Archdiocesan Engineer and the structural engineers from Wiss, Janney, Elstner Associates (WJE), we conducted an extensive investigation of the problem. We performed a water test and doused the west side of the bell tower with water and in less than five minutes noticed water coming in on the northeast walls of the choir loft. We also made a few openings around the bell tower and in the roof to examine further the state and integrity of the structure and look for any potential problems.

In January 2018, when we began to replace the ceiling in the choir loft, it confirmed our initial hope that the water infiltration was not from the roof. We proceeded to finish the replacement of the ceiling and as an additional precautionary measure, installed a water-proofing liner on the wood deck.

The report of WJE revealed cracks at the corners of the bell tower. Some of the exterior stone cladding on the tower is displaced and the underlying brick masonry has suffered freeze-thaw deterioration. The scope of work proposed by WJE addresses the problem of water infiltration and securing the structural integrity of the bell tower.

It was recommended that this work be done in two phases. The first phase will focus on arresting water infiltration into the structure. This will involve removing part of the slate roof to erect



scaffolding and perform masonry repairs on the bell tower as well as the cricket between the roof and the bell tower. This phase of the work will be completed before thanksgiving.

The second phase of the work will begin in early spring and will include the necessary masonry build as well as grinding and repointing of the entire bell tower. In order to accomplish this task, there will be scaffolding around the entire bell tower, and for our protection, a canopy across the front of the Basilica. We hope to complete both phases of the work on the bell tower by fall of 2019.

I am sure by now it must have crossed your mind as to how are we going to pay for this. Quite simply, we have to dip into our savings. Thankfully, those who have gone before us had the wisdom and foresight to put away some funds for situations such as this.

The estimated cost of these repairs is 1.3 million dollars. We have been hit by a perfect storm. We had to replace the ceiling, repair the bell tower and at the same time undertake the massive enterprise of realizing the goal of our Capital Campaign: the comprehensive renovation of the Benedict Center.

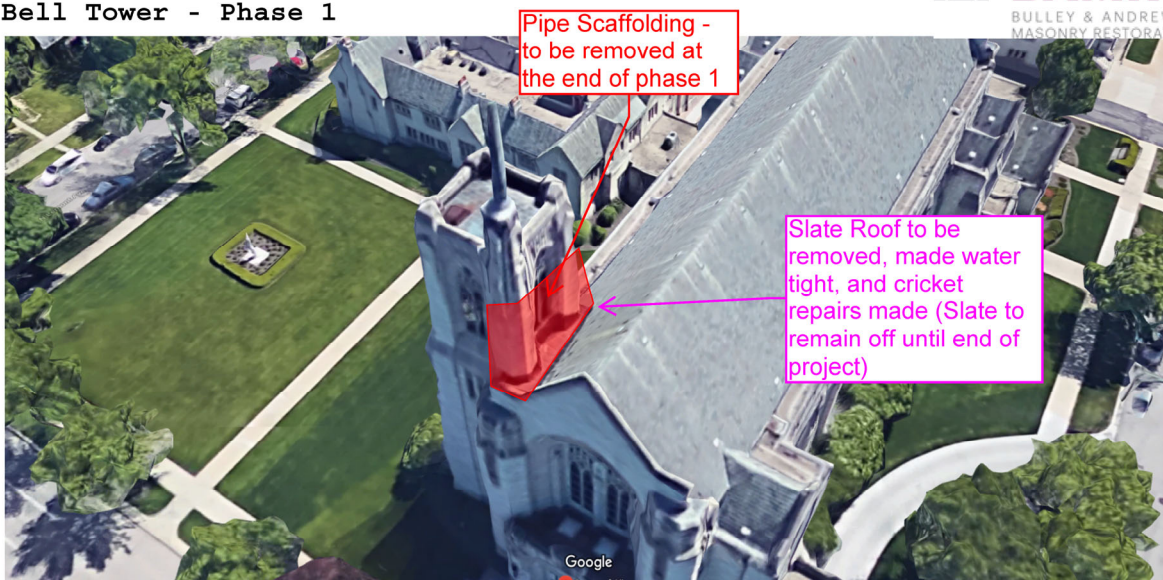
While all of this can be overwhelming, I assure you that we have extensively investigated the problem, as well as relied on the reports of the structural engineers, the advice and support of the finance council and the Archdiocese to arrive at the conclusion that it is prudent and necessary to resolve this problem sooner than later.

I trust the good people of Queen of All Saints appreciate the beauty of what has been handed down to us and as responsible stewards preserve, protect and enhance what we have received so that future generations may give glory to God in a place worthy of the honor of being a Basilica.

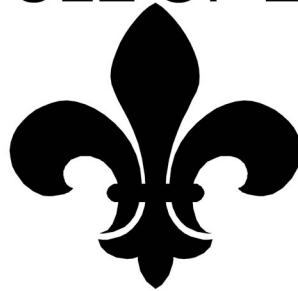

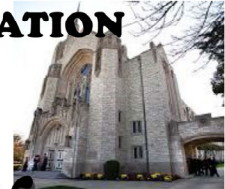

San Lorenzo Ruiz was born in 1600 in Binondo, Manila to a Chinese father and Filipino mother who were both Catholic. He was an altar boy growing up and was educated by Dominican Fathers. He was a member of the Confraternity of the Rosary. Ruiz was a husband and father to a daughter and two sons.

He left the Philippines in 1636 and moved to Japan where he suffered terrible persecution and was cruelly tortured and martyred. Despite the severe torture he endured he never lost his faith. Ruiz died on September 27, 1637.

Lorenzo Ruiz was beatified by Pope John Paul II during a Papal visit to Manila on February 18 1981. Ruiz was later canonized in Rome on World Mission Sunday October 18, 1987. St. Lorenzo Ruiz is the first Filipino Saint venerated in the Roman Catholic Church.

"If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." MARK 9:35

Jesus teaches us that we are called to serve one another. Sacrifice is not a word that many people like to hear. We think it means that we must give up something that we want. However, the literal meaning of sacrifice is "to make holy," from the words "sacer" (sacred) and "facere" (to make). In other words, we make our lives holy by sharing our gifts in the service of God.

Stewardship—A serious lifestyle commitment

There are many requests made of us to support others, including our frequent requests for support of our parish. Making decisions on a stewardship life can be confusing. Here are some thoughts on how to structure stewardship in our lives.

Intentional If we give "just because," that is not intentional. That does not show understanding of our call to stewardship. As a steward, we make a deliberate decision to live out the Christian life in a certain way. **That way is to thank God for all His blessings by returning to Him a portion of our time, talent and treasure.**

Planned As with any life event, we must make plans and adjustments to ensure important things take place. This is true in our sacrificial giving as well. We must plan ahead and **make stewardship of time, talent and treasure part of our lifestyle and budget.**

Proportionate In biblical tithing, a percentage of one's income is given back in gratitude to charitable causes. But a tithe applies only to financial gifts. **In stewardship, an intentional decision is made to give a certain percentage of our time, our talents and our income.** This expands the tithe to what it should be – proportionate giving of ALL gifts.

Our Basilica Repair Work Continues

- We began repairs of water damage around the transept windows during the summer, to include replacing the caulk around the storm windows as well as repairs to some of the support rods holding the stained glass windows in place. **We also took the opportunity to clean the stained glass windows before reinstallation. We hope you can see the difference now that we removed 60 years of grime!** The windows along the side aisles will also require some repairs, which will be scheduled over the next few years.
- The deteriorated marble behind the side altars has been removed and will be replaced with a modern lightweight replacement material similar to what was used in the sanctuary behind the main altar a few years ago. Currently there is a temporary substitute in place until all exterior stone work is completed.
- Our biggest current project will be to make masonry repairs to the bell tower, which started this week.**

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived.
