From Fr. Simon

A couple of my relatives from out of state and the country as well as friends marveled at the organization, efficiency and execution of a plan that really left them speechless. 'I can't believe it' was the common refrain. Finally, a big THANK YOU to the members of the Filipino American Community Association (FACA) for the wonderful desserts.

I want to express my gratitude to Fr. Trail, for his wonderful words of welcome at the beginning of Mass and for taking special care of the Bishop and con-celebrating priests. “Lynching in America: Confronting the Legacy of Racial Terror”

Tuesday, October 16th 7:30 – 9:00 PM

This special event will spotlight the experience of being present for the opening ceremonies of the National Memorial for Peace and Justice in Montgomery, AL earlier this year. You will learn about our nation's brutal history of racial terrorism, in which over 4,000 lynching victims were killed...lives which have not always been recognized by the public at large. You will see video and photographs of what has been described by a visitor as "the single greatest work of American architecture of the 21st century." You will also learn about how Bryan Stevenson and the Equal Justice Initiative persevered to make this amazing memorial a reality. You will hear about the narrative panels in the memorial, which explain the pretext that mobs used to carry out some of the lynchings. For in order to heal the deep wounds of our present, we must face the truth of our past.



Michael Rabbitt is an anti-racism workshop facilitator with Showing Up for Racial Justice (and previously for the Archdiocese of Chicago). He served on the Archdiocese's Anti-Racism Implementation Team and was a member of Catholics United for Racial Justice. He is also a long-time member of Workers for Racial and Ethnic Solidarity (WRES). Michael served on the inaugural Leadership Council for Within Our Lifetime, a national network of racial justice organizations dedicated to "ending racism within our lifetime." Michael is a parishioner at St. Mary of the Woods parish in Chicago, where he was the co-founder and chairperson of the Racial & Social Justice Ministry for 15 years. Michael received the St. Katherine Drexel Racial Justice Award in 2010 from the Archdiocese's Office for Racial Justice, in recognition of his "untiring commitment and public advocacy on behalf of racial justice."

- **sings once monthly** at the 11 a.m. Mass on the **third Sunday** of the month.



Seeking Spiritual Balance in Off-Kilter Times

Sometimes life feels like a three-ring circus. We teeter on a tightrope strung between chaotic and daily regimens. We juggle too many responsibilities or try to tame the wild excess of emotional upheaval set off by grief, disappointment, pain, fear or guilt. Being off-balance leave us weary, depressed and longing for time on the sidelines. This retreat offers a way to step out of the center ring and move to the periphery for a time of prayer, sharing, silence and rest.

Our Basilica Repair Work Continues

- Most critically, our biggest current project will be masonry repairs to the bell tower, which has now begun and will extend to early next year.
- We began repairs of water damage around the transept windows during the summer, to include replacing the caulk around the storm windows as well as repairs to some of the support rods holding the stained glass windows in place. We also took the opportunity to clean the stained glass windows before reinstallation. We hope you can see the difference now that we removed 60 years of grime! The windows along the side aisles will also require some repairs, which will be scheduled over the next few years.
- The deteriorated marble behind the side altars has been removed and will be replaced with a modern lightweight replacement material. Currently there is a temporary substitute in place until all exterior stone work is completed.

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
