From Father Simon



Every year the Archdiocese honors members of the faithful by presenting them the *Christifideles* Award. The award was named after the Apostolic Exhortation of Saint John Paul II whose English title is *On the Vocation and Mission of the Lay Faithful*. It is bestowed upon an individual or individuals who have demonstrated by participation in parish life, the personal and ministerial renewal set forth by the Apostolic Exhortation, *Christifideles Laici*, calling the laity to the vocation of responsibility for the Church's life springing from the gift and mission of their baptism.

Each pastor in the Archdiocese is asked to consider the main themes of the Apostolic Exhortation and, in light of that reflection, nominate a person or persons whose participation in the life of the parish most reflects those themes.

The criteria for the award are:

1. The individual or individuals are to be practicing Catholics who manifest an understanding of the teachings of the Church and have been graced with a life formed in the Catholic spiritual tradition.
2. The individual or individuals have used their talents to deepen the life of the Church in the parish or have served the ministry of the parish in an extraordinary way.
3. The nomination for the award has been advanced by the pastor of the parish in consultation with the Parish Pastoral Council.
4. The Episcopal Vicar approves the nomination.

This year, Joe Onofrio and Eileen Neis of our parish were nominated to receive the award from our Vicar General, Bishop Ron Hicks in a ceremony at Holy Name Cathedral that took place this past Sunday. Eileen could not be present for the award ceremony as she was hosting an event for Regina Dominican High School.



The form which I must submit to the Vicar's office has only a very few lines in which to summarize the reasons for the nomination. On this year's form I wrote the following:

Joe and Eileen are longtime parishioners and are actively involved in all aspects of parish life. Joe is currently the president of the Parish Pastoral Council and is past-president of our Men's Club. During his tenure as president of the Men's Club, Joe conducted an audit of the evangelizing mission of the Men's Club through its many activities. Eileen is a pillar of our Elizabeth Ministry and is always ready to respond to any request for prayer or meals. They are exemplary parents to their only child, Francesca.



When the Office of the Archbishop notified Joe and Eileen that they were this year's recipients of this prestigious award, they were surprised to learn of the selection. Not unlike those who have previously received this honor, they too did not think they deserved such an award. They love Queen of All Saints Parish so much so that they cannot conceive of being a parishioner in any other way. I believe they deserve it - and richly so. Please keep Eileen & Joe in your prayers as they continue to serve our parish now and into the future. God bless them and their daughter.

This special event will spotlight the experience of being present for the opening ceremonies of the National Memorial for Peace and Justice in Montgomery, Alabama earlier this year. You will learn about our nation's brutal history of racial terrorism, in which over 4,000 lynching victims were killed... lives which have not always been recognized by the public at large. You will see video and photographs of what has been described by a visitor as "the single greatest work of American architecture of the 21st century." You will also learn about how Bryan Stevenson and the Equal Justice Initiative persevered to make this amazing memorial a reality. You will hear about the narrative panels in the memorial, which explain the pretext that mobs used to carry out some of the lynchings. For in order to heal the deep wounds of our present, we must face the truth of our past.



Michael Rabbitt is an anti-racism workshop facilitator with Showing Up for Racial Justice (and previously for the Archdiocese of Chicago). He served on the Archdiocese's Anti-Racism Implementation Team and was a member of Catholics United for Racial Justice. He is also a long-time member of Workers for Racial and Ethnic Solidarity (WRES). Michael received the St. Katherine Drexel Racial Justice Award in 2010 from the Archdiocese's Office for Racial Justice. In 2016, Michael, together with his wife Sarah, received the Chicago Archdiocese's Christifideles Award.





Our Basilica Repair Work Continues

- Most critically, our biggest current project will be masonry repairs to the bell tower, which has now begun and will extend to early next year.
- We began repairs of water damage around the transept stained glass windows during the summer. We also took the opportunity to clean the stained glass windows before reinstallation. We hope you can see the difference in the nave windows now that we removed 60 years of grime! The windows along the side aisles will also require some repairs, which will be scheduled over the next few years.
- The deteriorated marble behind the side altars has been removed and will be replaced with a modern lightweight replacement material. Currently there is a temporary substitute in place until all exterior stone work is completed.

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
