# FROM FATHER SIMON



## *A few comments from our listening session...*

Ten days ago, we had a ‘Listening Session’ for our parish on the issue of clergy sex abuse. About twenty people attended this session. The focus of the evening was two-fold:

1. to give people a chance to express their feelings in the face of this continued crisis within the Church, and
2. to formulate questions and concerns that the authorities, our Holy Father and the Bishops, should address not only at the Vatican Summit but into the foreseeable future.

Among the feelings expressed were disappointment, sadness, confusion, being left out and let down, challenged, frustration with the lack of communication, the need to be strong in our faith and, finally, a willingness to be a part of the solution.

The questions could be broadly summarized into three categories:

- 1) Accountability and Transparency – Will there be an independent lay review board that will have oversight of the actions, or failure to take action, on the part of the bishops and leaders? Will this board include professionals, and if so, to whom will they report? We need transparency of the whole process.
- 2) Future – Are those preparing for the priesthood emotionally mature and psychologically and sexually healthy? Are they trained to minister in our contemporary culture? Is there a way to screen out potential sexual predators? What plans are in place, if any, to address the shortage of priests?
- 3) Victim Survivors and Abusers - Will there be a meaningful relationship between the Church and victim survivors? How does the Church deal with the priests found guilty in a caring way? What kind of Christian care and concern does the Church extend to them?

These questions were forwarded to our vicar, Bishop Mark Bartosic, who in turn will bring it to Cardinal Blase Cupich who will discuss them at next month’s Vicariate Listening Session. The current Vatican Summit on clergy sexual abuse is another step on a painful journey for all of us to understand abuse, to take the necessary steps to prevent abuse, to care for the victims and to make sure that no case is covered up or buried. I ask for your continued prayers for victims of abuse and the entire Church as we continue the process of cleansing and healing.


## *Looking forward to Lent...*

Please mark your calendars to be with us for about an hour or so from Monday, March 11 through Wednesday, March 13, in the evening beginning at 7:30pm. The Parish Council will suggest practices based on fasting, almsgiving and prayer to help us in our Lenten journey. Please watch for the calendar in upcoming bulletins.



The ministry of Extraordinary Minister of Communion is open to any parishioner, high school age or older. Because of the flexibility in serving with no specific schedule, high school students are especially encouraged to consider this ministry. Ministers simply sign up in the Sacristy for a station at whichever Mass they happen to attend.

There are two training sessions scheduled for new Eucharistic ministers. You need only attend one of these. The training dates are: Saturday, March 16 at 11:30 am or Thursday, March 21 at 7:30 pm.

## School Registration



- Please present a Birth Certificate (not the hospital certificate) and Baptismal Certificate for all new students.

4-year-old Preschool to Grade 8 children transferring from other schools – public, private or parochial, will be accepted on an individual basis. At the time of registration, copies of the most current progress report, report card and standardized testing are to be submitted with all registration forms.

- There is a \$50.00 non-refundable registration fee per child for 3-year-old Preschool and 4-year-old Preschool and a \$200.00 non-refundable registration fee per family for Kindergarten through Grade 8, which will be applied toward tuition.
- Age Requirements:
  - Three-Year-Old Preschool: Child must be 3 years of age by September 1, 2019
  - Four-Year-Old Preschool: Child must be 4 years of age by September 1, 2019
  - Kindergarten: Child must be 5 years of age by September 1, 2019
  - Grade One: Child must be 6 years of age by September 1, 2019

## Understanding Our Parish Finances

We rely on three main sources of funds:

- **Sundays, Holidays, UPP** - This is our regular revenue and is by far the largest source of funds to pay for our parish operations. In a sense, this is what “keeps the lights on,” by paying for our staff, our routine repairs and maintenance, and the other day-to-day costs of running the parish.
- **Long-Term Savings** - We are blessed with savings resulting from the generosity of the past, including parish and school endowments. The earnings from these accounts is used to supplement our regular revenue to balance the budget and, on occasion, to pay for extraordinary repairs. We have recently drawn upon our savings deeply to pay for unanticipated Basilica repair costs, including the ceiling project, the bell tower project, and other repairs (see photo on right of Sacred Heart side altar project) and now need to take steps to replenish those savings. **We will need a significant increase in our Sunday collections to pay ourselves back and restore our savings back to a prudent level.**
- **Capital Campaign** - Our capital campaign drive will be used to make our older parish buildings (the Benedict Center and the Lemont and Keene Avenue buildings) more suitable for today’s and tomorrow’s needs, including making better use of space for school needs and for the needs of our increasing numbers of lay ministries. **Our new construction projections require us to raise our pledge target from \$5,000,000 to \$6,000,000, and we have already raised \$200,000 of that new target. Please consider how you can help us reach our new goal.**

*We believe that a well-informed parish membership deserves an explanation of parish finances. Please be as generous as you can in your Christmas and other year-end giving to our parish.*

## The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

## The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

## Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick


