We warm Lent

We will begin the season of Lent on Wednesday March 6. As the sun takes a little longer each evening to settle beyond the horizon, the weather grows warmer (hopefully) and life emerges once more, it is a reminder to us that Lent can be our connecting point to the season of nature.

But this season of nature is messy. As the snows of winter lie on the ground, things get covered, trampled and windblown. Winter brings with it chilling winds that push things over, mess things up and even break things. As the snow melts we are left to discover the trash, the litter, the mud and the branches beneath the snow.

It's much like our lives. Over time, our hearts and souls, when left unattended, get messy. Lent invites us to deal with the mess. This is not about quickly cleaning things up and pretending they were never there, nor is it about ignoring the mess. Lent invites us to roll up our sleeves and sort through the debris of our lives.

We are confronted with our mess and we mess up our foreheads with a little dirt on Ash Wednesday. Ashes symbolize something that is blunt, primal and speaks the language of the soul. Something inside each of us knows exactly why ashes are such a powerful symbol: "Dust you are and to dust you shall return!" Ashes are dust and dust is soil, *humus*. Humanity and humility come from there. It is no accident that ashes have always been a major symbol within all religions. To put on ashes, to sit in ashes, is to say publicly and to yourself that you are reflective, in a penitential mode, that this is not "ordinary time" for you, that you are not in a season of celebration, that you are grieving some of the things you have done and lost, that some important work is going on silently inside you.

To facilitate this growth within us, the Church encourages us to observe the three disciplines of Lent – almsgiving, fasting and prayer. Most of us will begin our annual purge of 'giving up something for Lent'. As I mentioned in this column last week, Lent isn't simply about us 'giving up' something. The real grace is when we recognize that Lent is a season in which God wants to *give us* something. God wants to help us transform our lives.

This year, as a parish community, we will focus on responding to the call of discipleship. This involves that we be with and learn from our master and teacher, Jesus Christ. While I encourage you to attend daily Mass during Lent, I would also ask you to consider to pray the Stations of the Cross with us on Fridays at 4pm or spend some time in silent prayer during our adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Monday evenings from 7 to 8pm so that you can be with Jesus. I also want to draw your attention and invite you to be part of two important upcoming parish offerings.



The first is our parish Lenten Mission. Please plan to be with us on March 11, 12 & 13 for about an hour beginning at 7:30pm to listen to our mission preacher, Fr. Anthony Gittins. He will expound on what it means to be a disciple and offer examples from the New Testament of how individuals responded to the call to discipleship.

Secondly, the Parish Pastoral Council has put together a calendar, found on the next page, that suggests ways in which we can embrace the disciplines of fasting, almsgiving and prayer in our day to day lives so that we can grow in the virtues of self-control, compassion, courage, faith, generosity, justice and joy. Each week there will be a scripture passage on which to reflect. It will offer an opportunity to grow in a particular virtue through suggested actions that highlights one or more Lenten disciplines.

May our journey through Lent provide an opportunity to walk more closely with Jesus, who desires our presence, sometimes more than we desire His.

Stations of the Cross

Every Friday during Lent at 4pm until Good Friday which is at 3pm.

Lenten Holy Hour

Every Monday night (except March 11th), at 7pm is a Lenten Holy Hour with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament

Sacrament of Reconciliation

Since all Christians are connected together through the Church which is the Body of Christ, this Sacrament reconciles one with the Lord and with the Church.

Individual Confession - Saturday mornings, 8:30am until all are heard.

Mondays, except March 11, during the Lenten Holy Hour, 7 to 8pm.

Adult Formation

Parish Lenten Mission, evenings of March 11, 12 and 13 at 7:30pm.

Almsgiving

Lenten Regulations

All members of the Christian faithful in their own way are bound to do penance in virtue of divine law. In order that all may be joined in a common observance of penance, penitential days such as the season of Lent are prescribed during which the Christian faithful in a special way, pray, perform works of piety and charity, and deny themselves by fulfilling their responsibilities more faithfully and especially by observing fast and abstinence according to the norms of the following directive (Canon 1249).

Fasting

All adults up to their 60th year are required to fast. According to Canon 97, #1, a person who has completed the 18th year, is an adult. The day of fast during Lent is Ash Wednesday and the day of fast during the Triduum is Good Friday.

Penance and Good Works

The faithful are encouraged to attend daily Mass, to receive Holy Communion, to participate in the sacrament of Penance and to receive absolution; to take part as frequently as possible in public and private exercises of piety, to give generously to works of religion and charity, to perform acts of kindness towards the sick, aged and the poor, to practice voluntary self-denial especially regarding food and drink and worldly amusements; and to pray more fervently, particularly for the intentions of the Holy Father.

Abstinence

All persons 14 or older are required to abstain from meat products on Fridays during Lent, as well as on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Meat and products including meat are not to be eaten.

FROM ILLINOIS BISHOPS

Illinois Bishops Warn Against Extreme Abortion Legislation in General Assembly

As Illinois faces so many pressing issues involving human life and dignity, it is incomprehensible that our elected officials have decided the pressing issue of the day is to enhance the chances that the lives of the most vulnerable and voiceless will be taken. Their efforts, similar to recent actions in New York and Virginia, focus on corrupting our God-given right to life and sowing unnecessary division.

House Bill 2495 and Senate Bill 1942, misnamed the Reproductive Health Act, include so many harmful provisions the full effect of these bills can hardly be imagined. We know the legislation:

- seeks to define abortion as health care and a fundamental right;
- removes abortion clinics from a regulatory framework designed for significant medical procedures;
- attacks a carefully constructed agreement in law on how hospitals care for the victims of sexual assault;
- repeals the ban on partial birth abortion;
- repeals legal protections for doctors and hospitals who decline to participate in abortions;
- requires private health insurance in Illinois to fully cover the cost of abortion;
- removes the requirement that only doctors can perform abortions;
- as well as many other changes that in totality require us to treat abortion as a celebrated right instead of a heart-wrenching tragedy.

Abortion is not health care. It is the intentional taking of innocent and defenseless human life. Moreover, provisions in the law that allow healthcare providers to live and work in accordance with their sincerely-held moral beliefs are not wrong. Freedom of religion and conscience protections are fundamental rights, enshrined in our state and federal constitutions, and they must be respected.

House Bill 2467 and Senate Bill 1594 seek to repeal the Parental Notice of Abortion Act. This law, which has been in statute since 1995 and enforced since 2013, ensures parents are involved in profound medical decisions involving their children. Every other state bordering Illinois – Wisconsin, Indiana, Kentucky, Missouri and Iowa – requires at least parental notification. It is a broadly-supported, reasonable safeguard that allows parents to properly exercise love and care for their children. Our government should support families, not undermine them.

Opposition to these bills do not require one to assume a pro-life political position. Opposition should be the natural result of applying reason, fairness and a basic respect for human dignity to the examination of their contents. We cannot further devalue human life to the extent proposed in this legislation without dire consequences for ourselves.

We hope to lead all people of goodwill to rise up and be heard in opposition to these terrible efforts. Accordingly, in the days ahead, we will be distributing more information and calls to action. Today, we ask for your prayers and support as you certainly have ours.

According to liturgical guidelines, anyone considering this ministry should be a baptized Catholic in good standing with the church, who attends Sunday


Mass regularly. The minister will be a person of faith who believes in God, follows Christ and trusts in the Holy Spirit.

School Registration



- Please present a birth certificate (not the hospital certificate) and Baptismal Certificate for all new students.
- 4-year-old Preschool to Grade 8 children transferring from other schools public, private or parochial, will be accepted on an individual basis. At the time of registration, copies of the

most current progress report, report card and standardized testing are to be submitted with all registration forms.

- There is a \$50.00 non-refundable registration fee per child for 3-year-old Preschool and 4-year-old Preschool and a \$200.00 non-refundable registration fee per family for Kindergarten through Grade 8, which will be applied toward tuition.
- Age requirements:
 - ⇒ Three-Year-Old Preschool: Child must be 3 years of age by September 1, 2019
 - ⇒ Four-Year-Old Preschool: Child must be 4 years of age by September 1, 2019
 - ⇒ Kindergarten: Child must be 5 years of age by September 1, 201
 - ⇒ Grade One: Child must be 6 years of age by September 1, 2019

Be A Good Steward of the Lenten Season

The Lenten season prepares us for the celebration of Easter. It is a time for Christians to embrace prayer, fasting and almsgiving in a more concerted way. For some it is a time of healing, or an opportunity to repair spiritual brokenness. For others it is simply a good time to cultivate their spiritual lives in a more disciplined manner.

The goal of Lenten practices is to prepare ourselves to enter into the paschal mystery of Holy Week with a more humble spirit and determination to follow Jesus Christ.

The ancient triad of prayer, fasting and almsgiving offers wonderful spiritual benefits. Being a good steward of these gifts by planning ahead and following through is essential to having a fruitful Lenten experience.

This spiritual discipline heightens our sense of generosity. Just as an increase in prayer and fasting leads us to be more grateful for the gifts we received, and promotes a greater awareness of others, almsgiving helps us to reach out to others in gratitude. Just as we don't "squeeze in" time to pray during Lent, we also do not scrutinize our checkbook when being generous with others.

Again, make a plan and let a meaningful sense of sacrifice be your guide.

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick


