FROM FATHER SIMON



For almost a year now, you will have noticed the scaffolding around the bell tower and are probably wondering how extensive are these repairs and when will they be completed.

In October 2017, after a couple of days of heavy rainfall, we noticed water on the north-east wall of the choir loft. Although there was water on both the north and east walls of the choir loft, there was no water on the ceiling tiles. A visual inspection in December 2017 revealed that there were cracks in the mortar joints on the west and north sides of the bell tower.

Upon the advice of the archdiocesan engineer and the structural engineers from Wiss, Janney, Elstner Associates (WJE), we conducted an extensive investigation of the problem. We performed a water test and doused the west side of the bell tower with water and in less than five minutes noticed water coming in on the northeast walls of the choir loft. We also made openings around the bell tower and in the roof to further examine the state and integrity of the structure and look for any potential problems.

The report of WJE revealed cracks at the corners of the bell tower. Some of the exterior stone cladding on the tower is displaced and the underlying brick masonry has suffered freeze-thaw deterioration. The scope of work proposed by WJE addresses the problem of water infiltration and securing the structural integrity of the bell tower.

It was recommended that this work be done in two phases. The first phase would focus on arresting water infiltration into the structure. This would involve removing part of the slate roof to erect scaffolding and perform masonry repairs on the bell tower as well as the cricket between the roof and the bell tower. This phase was completed by Thanksgiving last year. Since then we have noticed there has been no water infiltration into the choir loft, the area most noticeably affected by this issue.

The second phase of the work would begin in early spring of 2019 and would include the necessary masonry build as well as grinding and repointing of the entire bell tower, replacing spalled or cracked lannon stone, patching and repairing limestone and fixing the lightning protection system. As this work continued, we also discovered due to corrosion over time, the base of the cross at the top of the spire and the sphere below it were both split.

The structural engineers from WJE have advised us to clean and coat the steel with an epoxy that would prevent future corrosion, fabricate and install a new sphere made of a thicker gauge copper, remove, repair and reinstall the cross. You may have noticed the cross missing at the moment. We hope to finish work on the spire by the beginning of this coming October and finish all repairs to the bell tower by the end of November.

While all of this can be overwhelming, I assure you that we have extensively investigated the problem, as well as relied on the reports of the structural engineers, the advice and support of the finance council and the Archdiocese to arrive at the conclusion that it is prudent and necessary to resolve these issues sooner than later. As responsible stewards, it is our duty and honor to preserve, protect and enhance what we have received so that future generations may give glory to God in a place worthy of the honor of the designation 'Basilica of Queen of All Saints'.



Stewardship - Understanding our Parish Finances

We rely on three main sources of funds:

Sundays, Holidays, UPP — This is our regular revenue and is by far the largest source of funds to pay for our parish operations. In a sense, this is what “keeps the lights on” by paying for our staff, our routine repairs, maintenance, and the other day-to-day costs of running the parish.

Long-Term Savings — We are blessed with savings resulting from the generosity of the past, including parish and school endowments. The earnings from these accounts is used to supplement our regular revenue to balance the budget and, on occasion, to pay for extraordinary repairs. We have drawn upon our savings deeply to pay for the unanticipated basilica repair costs, including the ceiling project, the bell tower project, and other repairs and now must take steps to replenish those savings. *We will need a significant increase in our Sunday collections to pay ourselves back and restore our savings back to a prudent level.*

Capital Campaign — Our capital campaign drive is aimed at making our older parish buildings (the Benedict Center and the Lemont & Keene Avenue buildings) more suitable for today’s and tomorrow’s needs, including making better use of space for school needs and for the needs of our increasing numbers of lay ministries. *Our final construction projections require us to raise our pledge target from \$5,000,000 to \$6,000,000, and we have already raised \$200,000 of that new target. Please consider how you can help us reach our new goal.*

We believe that well-informed parish membership deserves an explanation of parish finances. Please be as generous as you can in supporting our parish and the many ways it touches and helps all of us at all times of our lives.

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
