FROM FATHER SIMON



Nearly two thousand years ago, two disillusioned youths consoled each other as they turned their backs on Jerusalem and were heading to Emmaus, a town just seven miles away. They moved slowly, depression having taken the spring from their steps. They were hurting and there was reason. Their messiah and their dreams had just been crucified. There was fear - fear that they themselves might be crucified, the fear of ‘where do we go from here?’, and the fear that comes from the realization that perhaps nothing makes a difference after all and maybe our dreams and our hopes point to emptiness. They had been so excited, so full of hope. The “un-crucified” Christ had filled them with a dream.

One weekend, one “black” Friday, had changed it all. They walked now, realistic again, more than 48 hours older, their dreams, like their messiah, dead, entombed. They had grown up a lot in one weekend. There was a hard lesson learned, but it brought a hurt and a disappointment beyond words. Then a stranger caught their step and caught their mood. They didn’t recognize him.

But the stranger begins to find the words: “Do they not yet understand the ways of God? His words burned in them, touching and soothing that deep part of the heart where the dream had lain. But they were only words, a balm, a momentary salve, nothing more. The doubt, the hurt and the fear, these lingered on. Emmaus and twilight appeared at the same time. The stranger had been a consolation. Why not ask him to stay? He did. They continued to share, bread and consolation. Suddenly their eyes were opened. Their minds and hearts were opened even further. They understood. Jesus was with them again.

The theme for Catechetical Sunday, which we celebrate today, is ‘Stay with Us’. It calls us to focus our attention on laying a strong foundation in faith and building stronger ties to the community called “church”. Many of us are aware of the stark reality of declining numbers in parishes. Today about twenty-five percent of the US adult population state that they are not affiliated with any of the mainstream religious groups – most of them are young adults. Many of these disaffiliated are Christians and they have a bevy of reasons for their current status. Some have left the Church because they dissent with church teachings, some have simply drifted away and some are hurt and wounded. But in most cases the flame of faith is still alive in their hearts.

On this Catechetical Sunday, we have to ask ourselves as a community, what do we have to offer to those who have doubts and are disappointed in order for them to ‘stay with us’? What, as Church, do we have to offer to a world in which nothing seems to be working? Let us begin with hope and forgiveness. The stranger in the gospel wasn’t disappointed at not being recognized nor threw up his arms in disbelief at their lack of understanding. He took the time to discuss their doubts, discuss the scriptures and continually offer them bread and consolation. He rekindled their hopes and dreams.

As pastor of this wonderful community, my primary responsibility is the spiritual welfare of the flock entrusted to me – to teach and preach the Word. I am grateful to the Pastoral Staff of the parish, our director of Religious Education, Erika Tate, our principal Emily Carlson and the many catechists and volunteers who help me fulfill this sacred duty. The Faith Formation Program at Queen of All Saints depends on the stewardship of dozens of catechists and volunteers - men, women and older teens, throughout the year. Although the role of catechist may take on many hats at various times, catechists are first and most important of all, a model for children, teens, and adults of all ages, of what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. By agreeing to be a catechist, they join a long line of dedicated men and women who have answered God’s call to share their faith with others. However, as important as that role is, it is not the most important one in the faith formation of our young learners. That role is reserved for their parents, as it is mentioned in a blessing of the parents at the baptism of their child, “they will be their first teachers in the ways of faith. May they also be the best of teachers.” Our role is to support parents to the best of our ability.

RCIA Inquiry


Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

San Lorenzo Ruiz was born in 1600 in Binondo, Manila to a Chinese father and Filipino mother who were both Catholic. He was an altar boy growing up and was educated by Dominican Fathers. He was a member of the Confraternity of the Rosary. Ruiz was a husband and father to a daughter and two sons.

He left the Philippines in 1636 and moved to Japan where he suffered terrible persecution and was cruelly tortured and martyred. Despite the severe torture he endured he never lost his faith. Ruiz died on September 27, 1637.

Lorenzo Ruiz was beatified by Pope John Paul II during a Papal visit to Manila on February 18 1981. Ruiz was later canonized in Rome on World Mission Sunday October 18, 1987. St. Lorenzo Ruiz is the first Filipino Saint venerated in the Roman Catholic Church.

Still Beloved After All These Years



The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
