## FROM FATHER SIMON



For centuries people have been travelling to the Holy Land to have a physical connection with the places in which Jesus lived and ministered and to strengthen their spiritual relationship with Him. We are all aware that there are four Gospels, but to better grasp them we need a fifth gospel – an understanding of the land, people and customs. As a student of scripture, my first visit to the Holy Land gave me a whole different perspective of the gospel stories and a better understanding of the history of God's people who live in this region and their relations with their neighbors.

As you read this, I will be on my seventh pilgrimage to the Holy Land along with fifty-two other pilgrims mostly from our parish and others from the Chicago-land area. For most, it is their first pilgrimage, for a few who are returning it is an opportunity to recapture their first experience and build on it. Each trip has awakened something new in me. For every pilgrim, it is surely a time to become sensitized to life in ways that are not part of everyday experience. Each destination would lead a pilgrim into a level of meditation and reflective thought. I encourage every pilgrim to banish any pre-conceived ideas they have of the land, the mental images they have stored up over the years of listening to the gospel stories and to be open to new encounters with the gospel stories they will hear once again. There should be an openness to a new relationship, a readiness to give and receive of oneself to everyone who passes by.

Our goal during this pilgrimage is to visit as many places as we can, and allow each site to draw us in to feel that connection with Jesus and his disciples. We will celebrate Mass at the Basilica of the Annunciation, the site of the Transfiguration, in the church built on the site of the home of Peter's mother-in-law, in Bethlehem, at the Holy Sepulcher and at Gethsemane. We will renew our baptismal vows at the River Jordan, couples will renew their marriage vows at Cana and we will carry a cross praying the stations and reliving the events of Palm Sunday. While we are there, I do promise to remember Queen of All Saints parish and all its people in my prayers, and I do ask you to pray for all of us that through this experience we may grow closer and stronger in our relationship with Jesus.

**San Lorenzo Ruiz** was born in 1600 in Binondo, Manila to a Chinese father and Filipino mother who were both Catholic. He was an altar boy growing up and was educated by Dominican Fathers. He was a member of the Confraternity of the Rosary. Ruiz was a husband and father to a daughter and two sons.

He left the Philippines in 1636 and moved to Japan where he suffered terrible persecution and was cruelly tortured and martyred. Despite the severe torture he endured he never lost his faith. Ruiz died on September 27, 1637.

Lorenzo Ruiz was beatified by Pope John Paul II during a Papal visit to Manila on February 18 1981. Ruiz was later canonized in Rome on World Mission Sunday October 18, 1987. St. Lorenzo Ruiz is the first Filipino Saint venerated in the Roman Catholic Church.

*Still Beloved After All These Years*





## Religious Education News

### Registration

Registration for the 2019-2020 RE school year is still open! The QASRE program begins at kindergarten and goes through eighth grade. Our program focuses on building Christ's disciples who will go out and glorify the Lord through their lives. Students wanting to participate in the sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation must attend a minimum of two years of Religious Education as per the archdiocesan requirement. First Reconciliation and Communion preparation begins at 1<sup>st</sup> grade. Confirmation preparation begins at 7<sup>th</sup> grade.

## From the Archives

### Before Queen of All Saints (Part I)

The land on which the QAS campus sits was essentially all forest. As immigrant farmers began settling north of Chicago in the 1840s & 1850s, they were purchasing land. A single acre of potential farmland could have cost anywhere from \$4 to \$6 during this time. Throughout the 1870s & 1880s, the number of residents living in what today is Evanston, Lincolnwood, Skokie and the neighborhood of Sauganash, progressively grew.

Around this time, the only Catholic parishes in the area were St. Joseph's in Wilmette (est. 1843), St. Henry's in Chicago (est. 1851), St. Mary's in Evanston (est. 1865) and St. Peter's in Skokie (est. 1869). All predominately founded by a combination of Irish, German and Luxenberg immigrants.

## Fall Stewardship - A Time to Recommit to our Parish

If you are a regular reader of this page, you know that our parish has much to be grateful for and a wonderful capacity to face the challenges of the future.

Thanks to the ongoing generosity of our parishioners through our Sunday, Christmas and Easter collections, and our one and only parish-wide fundraiser, the United Parish Program, *our operations have been able to break even in recent years.*

However, on the capital side we encountered a series of major expenses in recent years, including *the replacement of the basilica ceiling and extensive repairs to the basilica bell tower, as well as a host of other water-related repairs which tend to afflict buildings the same age as ours.*

Fortunately, we were able to pay for those repairs by drawing on our savings, *which were prudently set aside by those who came before us for precisely that type of unforeseen problem.* We were able to begin repairs promptly before our problems got worse.

The good news is that we've addressed our immediate problems. The challenging news is that we are left with a serious hole in our savings. *Now it's time to address that problem.*

**We need to move from a mere break-even operations to instead generating at least \$5 million total surplus over the next 10 years to replenish our savings and restore our parish's financial position.** We will be talking more about this over the coming month, including how we can achieve this goal in the generous spirit that has always characterized the people of Queen of All Saints Basilica Parish.

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

## The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

## Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
