FROM FATHER SIMON



At the outset, I want to thank you for your prayers for those on the pilgrimage to the Holy Land. I do assure you that we remembered you in our prayers. We had a spirit-filled pilgrimage that exceeded the expectations of almost all of us. We were a little delayed in getting home, due to the thunder storms in Chicago last Friday, so it was about forty hours from the wake up call in Jerusalem to when we landed in Chicago – I don't think it can get any more 'biblical' than that.

One of the things we did at the beginning of the trip was to share with the group why each one of us was coming on this trip and what were our expectations. Invariably, almost all answered that they want to know more about their faith and grow in their relationship with Jesus. Something similar is happening in the gospel today.

What the apostles ask Jesus in our gospel today is impressive. "Increase our faith!" They do not ask that the people should say nice things about them. They do not ask that they should succeed by human standards. Rather, they ask just one thing, "Increase our faith!" They are asking for the things that are really the most important: a profound and solid faith, an unshakable trust in God. This means building all hope in God, holding everything in His hands, even when there is great trouble and when a strong contrary wind is blowing in their faces.

The saints come to mind when I think of such strong faith. They provide a firm handhold for others and give them confidence. Yet, what do we imagine when we talk about a 'strong faith'? Jesus' reply gives us food for thought: "If you had faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you." This is something quite impossible indeed, but even if your trust is as small as a mustard seed it is nonetheless strong and effective when it means trusting in God and not just in your own strength.

We may think that we will just not be able to manage it, but we can trust that God will help us nevertheless and that the Almighty will do things the way he chooses. Jesus expounds upon this in another parable. The servant has to deal with all of his tasks and only then can he rest. He is not deserving of any particular thanks if he has only performed his duty and done what he should. Do your part and God will do His part. Saint Ignatius of Loyola put it like this, "Act as if everything depended on you, and pray as if everything depended on God." Having faith does not mean taking it easy and letting everything take its course. We have to do what we can, but God will grant what is decisive. Dear God, please strengthen our trust in that!

RCIA Inquiry


Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Still Beloved After All These Years



Fall Stewardship — A Time to Recommit to our Parish

If you are a regular reader of this page you know that our parish has much to be grateful for and a wonderful capacity to face the challenges of the future.

Thanks to the ongoing generosity of our parishioners through our Sunday, Christmas and Easter collections, and our one and only parish-wide fundraiser, the United Parish Program, our parish operations have been able to break even in recent years.

However, on the capital side we encountered a series of major expenses in recent years, including the replacement of the basilica ceiling and extensive repairs to the basilica bell tower, as well as a host of other water-related repairs which tend to afflict buildings the same age as ours.

Fortunately, we were able to pay for those expenses by drawing on our savings, which were prudently set aside by those who came before us for precisely that type of unforeseen problem. We were able to begin repairs promptly before our problems got worse.

The good news is that we've addressed our immediate problems. The challenging news is that we are left with a serious hole in our savings. Now it's time to address that problem.

We need to move from mere break-even operations to instead generating at least \$5 million total surplus over the next 10 years to replenish our savings and restore our parish's financial position and better ensure our shared future. We will be talking more about this throughout the month, including how we can achieve this goal in the generous spirit that has always characterized the people of Queen of All Saints Basilica parish.

Many of us compartmentalize our faith, we bring it out only when we attend Mass or when we attend a parish event. Being a good steward requires discipline and striving to put God first in everything, all the time. The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
