FROM FATHER SIMON



‘Gratitude is the prayer of the heart; it is the heart of all prayer’.

In two weeks, we will gather to give thanks to God for his protection and blessings upon us as we celebrate 90 years as a faith-community in this neighborhood. It is a time to rededicate ourselves to the mission of Christ and being a beacon of hope to those around us and the world at large.

For the 2,800 family faith-community, the imposing basilica, where within its walls and in its shadows we celebrate our faith as a community, is our anchor and for the most part how we derive our identity as members of Queen of All Saints parish. However, we must never forget that in May of 1929, Cardinal Mundelein established Queen of All Saints as a parish. At that time, within just a few weeks, a small wooden structure that came in bit by bit from St. Giles parish in Oak Park was put back together and dedicated as the first church of Queen of All Saints Parish. The date was June 13, 1929. A short time later the Great Depression struck and despite the challenges, the community persevered, even though it wasn't easy to be generous, to support this infant faith community. To their persistence and generosity, we owe a debt of gratitude.

The pioneers, under the leadership of then pastor Fr. Francis “Packy” Ryan and later Msgr. Dolan, gathered in the church and in homes, (not under a huge tent, on a sprawling lawn, in the shadows of one of the most beautiful churches in the Chicago-land area), to celebrate community and raise funds. Within the first twenty-five years, they helped purchase the current property, put up the Keene and Lemont buildings, the Benedict Center and the rectory, so that we and the generations to


come may enjoy the benefits these facilities offer. We are grateful for their vision and their many sacrifices.

Gratitude is of course a wonderful thing. It reminds us how fortunate we are, and connects us more quickly to a sense of joy. And yet, to be honest, at times we struggle with gratitude. It may be because we take things for granted. It is true that there is almost always something for which to be grateful. At the very least, for most of us, we have a roof over our head and a beating heart. But sometimes, it is also true that we are going through difficult life circumstances – heartbreak, financial difficulties, loss, illness. During difficult times, an attitude of

gratitude might be soothing, a healthy way of dealing with the difficult emotions of grief, fear and anxiety and a reminder that not all is catastrophic in our world.

I invite you to join your fellow parishioners for a Mass of thanksgiving celebrating 90 years of blessings upon us as a faith community on Sunday, October 27 at 11 a.m. and at the reception that follows. See you in Church.



RESPECT LIFE REFLECTION

Christ Our Hope: In Every Season of Life

From the time we are knit together in our mothers' wombs until we take our final breaths, each moment of our lives is a gift from God. While every season of life brings its own challenges and trials, each season also gives us new opportunities to grow in our relationship with God.

Today the gift of life is threatened in countless ways. Those who are most vulnerable, rather than receiving the protection they deserve, are all too often seen as a burden and as expendable. As new attacks on human life continue to emerge, we can be tempted to despair, but Christ instead offers us unfailing hope.

Hope is not false optimism or empty positivity. Christian hope is something much more profound and goes to the very depths of our identity as followers of Christ.

Hope is the virtue “by which we desire the kingdom of heaven and eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ’s promises and relying not on our own strength, but on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit” (CCC, 1817).

Like us, Christ entered the world through the womb of a woman. He willingly experienced the fullness of human suffering. He breathed his last on the Cross at Calvary in order that He might save us. Therefore, “God is the foundation of hope: not any god, but the God who has a human face and who has loved us to the end” (*Spe salvi* 31).

Christians know “they have a future: it is not that they know the details of what awaits them, but they know in general terms that their life will not end in emptiness” (SS 2).

For this reason, a woman experiencing a difficult pregnancy can find the strength to welcome her precious child into the world. A man facing a terminal diagnosis can see that the end of his earthly life is only the beginning of eternal life with Christ.

The Church teaches us that “the one who has hope lives differently” (SS 2). Christ’s promise of salvation does not mean that we will be spared from suffering. Rather, the promise of salvation ensures that even in the darkest moments of our lives, we will be given the strength to persevere. By virtue of this Christian hope, we can face any challenge or trial. When the seas of life swell and we are battered by the waves, hope allows us to remain anchored in the heart of God. May we hold fast to Christ our hope, from the beginning of life to its very end.

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
