FROM FATHER SIMON



Last Sunday was a proud moment for our parish. The Archdiocese held a ‘by invitation only’ ceremony here at Queen of All Saints Basilica to confer ecclesial honors upon those nominated by their respective parishes. Since the parking lot at Holy Name Cathedral has been leased out and is under construction, the ‘top brass’ of the Archdiocese requested that we host the event. Cardinal Cupich with all his auxiliary bishops (seven of them) presided over the liturgical celebration and bestowed the *Christifideles* and *Bishop Quarter* Awards on the faithful.

The *Christifideles* award is bestowed upon an individual Catholic layperson who has demonstrated by participation in parish life, the personal and ministerial renewal called for by the Papal Exhortation, *Christifideles Laici*, calling the laity to the vocation of responsibility for the Church’s life springing from the gift and mission of their baptism.

The criteria for the award are:

- 1) The individual (or married couple) is to be a practicing Catholic who manifests an understanding of the teachings of the Church and has been graced with a life formed in the Catholic spiritual tradition.
- 2) The individual has used his/her talents to deepen the life of the Church in the parish or has served in an extraordinary way the ministry of the parish.
- 3) The nomination for the award has been advanced by the pastor of the parish in consultation with the Parish Pastoral Council.
- 4) The Episcopal Vicar approves of the nomination.

John and Jaikie Ceisel from our parish were honored with the *Christifideles Award*. Jaikie is a catechist in our SPRED program and John is part of the Social Justice Ministry of our parish, and both are members of our choir. This past year they opened their home and their hearts to welcome a family of refugees and have been working with them as well as with the appropriate agencies to help them in their efforts to be granted asylum and provide the necessary encouragement and aid to help them gain independence. Many of you have helped this cause as well.

We see Jesus in prayer more often in Luke’s gospel than the other Gospels. Obviously, prayer was important in Luke’s life, but we can say that Luke is teaching us that prayer was central in the life of Jesus and ought to be central in our lives too.

The *Bishop Quarter Award* is given to an individual or married couple at the Vicariate level. Mary Zeien received this honor for her work with *The Well of Mercy* which is an organization that not only provides a secure home for single, pregnant women in need, but encourages a program of change—offering opportunities for new beginnings and forging a path towards success for these women and their children. Queen of All Saints parish is honored to be associated with *The Well of Mercy* and supports this noble cause

by providing financial and material support and the gift of time, as best we can. Some of you may have seen Mary Zeien at our weekday 6:30am Mass.





The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
