FROM FATHER SIMON



On Wednesday, we started our Lenten journey. It is the forty-day period in which we are called to a conversion of heart through prayer, fasting and charitable works. The Church seeks, through its Lenten pilgrimage and the observance of Jesus' passion on the cross in Holy Week and his resurrection, to enable us to make an honest response to the questions the priest will ask us on Easter Sunday – “Do you reject sin so as to live in the freedom of God's children?” “Do you reject the glamour of evil and refuse to be mastered by sin?” “Do you reject Satan, father of sin and prince of darkness?”

The purpose of the Parish Pastoral Council's initiative '*'90 for 90'*' is to help us along this journey. Each of us has our own pace on this journey. It is not about who finishes the journey first, or in better shape. It is about all of us being on the journey together, supporting and encouraging each other. I pray that all of us make an effort to be part of this initiative. May our Lenten journey lead us to the joys of Easter!

Last weekend, with the sale of our raffle tickets, we launched this year's United Parish Program, scheduled for May 15. In a couple of weeks, you will receive an invitation to this year's event, where we will gather as a community under a majestic white tent, on a sprawling green field, to celebrate the spirit of community that binds us as one, to give thanks to God for bringing us together as members of his family, to remember and thank God for all the generous benefactors who have sustained this great parish in the past and who continue to support it in the present, and finally, to raise funds to support the many ministries and activities of the parish that are essential to our vitality, now, and into the future.

The UPP is our one and only fundraiser. It aims to bring together the many and varied organizations in the parish and work as one toward a common goal - to build up the Body of Christ and to care for and support the sacramental, educational and ministerial needs of the parish community. It is therefore vital that every member of the parish community participates in this united endeavor.

I appeal to every family in the parish – and we have close to 3000 families – to participate in and support the UPP. There are many ways to do this in addition to buying a ticket and attending. You can be a sponsor, take out an advertisement in the event booklet, offer an item for auction, buy some raffle tickets, or help one of the many committees preparing for the event. Our goal is to raise \$275,000 in order to be able to continue to support our parish activities. That's a lot of money but we can do it with the help and support of every single family in the parish. 

Fr. Corey Brost, C.S.V., is a member of the Clerics of St. Viator, a religious order of brothers, priests and lay associates. He joined the order in 1987 and has served since then as a religious educator, classroom teacher and high school administrator. He served as president of St. Viator High School in Arlington Heights from 2013-2016 and left with support from the Viatorians to work full time as an advocate for immigrant rights and interfaith bridge-building.

At present, Father Brost is executive director of Viator House of Hospitality, a northwest suburban interfaith program that provides a home and services for up to 25 young men, 18-23 years old, who've fled their homelands, are seeking asylum in the U.S. and have no family to live with while they await their legal proceedings.

Additionally, Fr. Brost co-founded the Children of Abraham Coalition in 2010 to counter the increasing faith-based prejudice he saw in our nation and around the world. The Coalition, a 501(c) 3 non-profit located in the northwest suburbs, plans events for all ages that promote interfaith relationships, reverence and literacy. It is governed by a board of Muslim, Jewish and Christian leaders, one third of them high school and college age.





Dear Parishioners,

The season of Lent is a time of renewal and reflection, when we are encouraged as followers of Christ to participate in prayer, fasting and service. The Lenten journey of each person is a personal expression of faith. All Queen of All Saints parishioners and students are invited to participate together and support each other this Lenten season in a special way to commemorate the 90th Anniversary of our parish.

What is “90 for 90”? Well, it’s what you make it. Can you add 90 seconds of prayer to your day? Could you read 90 Psalms? Can you donate 90 diapers to a charity? Is it possible to go 90 minutes without your phone? Ninety of something may sound like a lot, but what you do and how you do it is up to you. It’s not a contest, competition or checklist, but a way to challenge ourselves to look at what we say and do in preparation for the Resurrection of Christ this Easter.

The suggested items on our list are just a starting point; your Lenten journey is your own. There is room for every person, every family, every ministry to put their own personal touch on it. Many ministries will be hosting “90 for 90” events, and we hope you will join in if you can. A great way to start is to spend some time at our upcoming Parish Mission with Fr. Corey Brost on March 2, 3 & 4.

Christ inspired us to offer others mercy and care and encouraged us to imitate his actions. To inspire and encourage our parishioners and students, we hope you will share your good works by going a little beyond discrete actions. Please consider writing down your “90 for 90” prayer or practice and placing it into the receptacle at the front of the Basilica. Additionally, we hope that you will consider sharing your personal Lenten journey on social media using the hashtag #qas90for90. We hope the stories of the generosity and faith of our community will inspire you on your own Lenten journey.

What does 90 mean to you?

PRAYER

- 90 minutes of added prayer per day or week
- 90 minutes of adoration (Monday evenings and Holy Thursday)
- pray for 90 people (even if it's one sentence!)
- journal 90 words of reflection on a prayer, scripture or other inspiration
- read 90 chapters of the Bible (89 chapters in the Gospels, only 2 per day!)
- read 90 Psalms
- make a list of 90 things you are grateful for
- make a list of 90 people you are grateful for
- pray 90 beads of the rosary (only 2 rosaries!)
- 90 seconds of conversation per day with God
- read 90 pages of a spiritual book
- listen to 90 minutes of worship music

FASTING

- 90 minutes of no electronics in the house
- 90 minutes of silence in the house
- limit electronics or media to 90 minutes per day or week
- fast from inactivity by adding 90 minutes of exercise per week
- spend 90 minutes outside with nature instead of indoors
- replace 90 minutes or miles of your commute with walking or biking
- donate or recycle 90 items you don't need anymore
- give up 90 of something (2 per day) to break a habit (cigarettes, drinks, snacks, etc.)
- skip \$90 of splurges
- listen to someone for 90 seconds without talking
- wait 90 seconds before saying or posting something unkind

- write 90 postcards for a cause or campaign
- purchase \$90 in supplies for a food pantry newhopefoodpantry.com chicagosfoodbank.org
- donate \$90 to a charity of your choice

Lenten Regulations

Each year the holy season of Lent provides us with a special time of grace and spiritual renewal so that we may become better instruments in sharing the Gospel message. All members of the Christian faithful in their own way are bound to do penance in virtue of divine law.

The faithful are encouraged during Lent to attend daily Mass, receive Holy Communion, participate in penance services, and receive sacramental absolution. We are also encouraged to take part in public and private exercises of piety, give generously to works of religion and charity, perform acts of kindness toward the sick, aged, and the poor, to practice voluntary self-denial, especially regarding food, drink and worldly amusements, and to pray more fervently, particularly for the intentions of the Holy Father.





Be a Good Steward of the Lenten Season

The Lenten season prepares us for the celebration of Easter. It is a time to embrace the “**three pillars of Lent,**” **prayer, fasting, and almsgiving** in a focused way. For some it is a time of healing, an opportunity to repair their spiritual brokenness. For others it is simply a good time to cultivate their spiritual lives in a more disciplined manner.

While these are very worthy goals, perhaps the most obvious goal of our Lenten practices is simply to prepare ourselves to enter into the Paschal Mystery of Holy Week with a more humble spirit and determination to follow Jesus Christ.

Being a good steward of the gifts given us by planning ahead and following through is essential to having a fruitful Lenten experience. Let’s consider almsgiving.

Almsgiving: This spiritual discipline heightens our sense of generosity. Just as an increase in **prayer** and **fasting** leads us to be more grateful for the gifts we’ve received, and promotes a greater awareness of others, **almsgiving helps us to reach out to others in gratitude.** Just as we don’t “squeeze in” time to pray during Lent, we also don’t scrutinize our checkbook when being generous with others. **Make a plan and let a meaningful sense of sacrifice be your guide.**

We offer our deep and prayerful thanks to everyone who contributed to this year’s Annual Catholic Appeal.

This is a wonderful way to show our stewardship support to our parish and to our city.

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated at 1:30pm two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A baptismal preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.






