## FROM FATHER SIMON



Thank you for your cooperation and indulgence in the preventative measures we put into place to minimize the potential spread of the coronavirus.

We live in a well-organized society. Everything is carefully planned ahead and, ideally, implemented in accordance with the plan. Errors or changes happening in the middle of the plan are not acceptable. Those whose lives are well organized are highly regarded. Those who do not plan well are not. Their lives may result in a lack of self-confidence. That's why today we often hear the expression "the age of uncertainty" among young people.

However, life is like a flowing stream. It is always moving and flexibly shaping itself along its way. Wherever it goes, it brings more life and bears more fruit. The continuous flow of life always brings about something new. The way the river flows is not always subject to planning.

The Scripture readings today give us beautiful images of transforming life. Abraham is called in a vision to leave his country and his father's house for a land that he hadn't known. He went as the Lord told him. He was not sure what would happen to him. St. Paul relied on God's grace and power. He stepped out with insecurity to bear witness to the Good News that Christ is risen as our Savior.

In the Gospel reading, the group of close friends - Peter, James and John - were taken away from the other disciples to witness the transfiguration of Jesus on a mountain. They saw their master Jesus gloriously transfigured. They were ecstatic. They had fore-tasted the glory of eternal life. The common point of those stories is that Abraham, Paul and the three disciples humbly listen to God's call and accept uncertainty in their lives.

People often say that life is a miracle. We believe even more - life is an *unstoppable* miracle. Jesus' resurrection abolished death, and established immortality, the *eternal life*. Our life now is a transformed life. It's unstoppable. It is always changing into new life. Death now is a necessary step of transition of old life to new life. Every moment of our life is a transforming time in which we can be transformed anew as persons.

Lent is a time to step out of our old self in order to be transformed into a new person. Accepting uncertainty and change is the first step to a new life. We can't afford to stand still. Life always keeps moving. If we move with it, we are carried on, refreshed and changed. We now carry within us the eternal life of Christ. We are invited to open our minds and hearts to his teachings. If we put our trust and hope in his words, our lives will surely be transformed each day.

## Coronavirus: Safety and Precautions

At Queen of All Saints we are very much aware of the growing risk from the Coronavirus, so out of an abundance of caution and in line with advice from public health experts, we will take the following steps to minimize the potential of transmission within our community, effective immediately and until further notice:

- Exchanging a friendly gesture during the sign of peace instead of shaking hands.
- Not offering the Precious Blood (wine) at Communion.
- Offering the Body of Christ only in open hands.
- Hand sanitizer will be available to parishioners and guests at all entrances.
- Our Ministers of Communion will continue their long-standing practice of using hand sanitizer before Communion.
- Additional cleaning of all pews and surface areas.
- The Holy Water fonts in the church will be emptied. However, there is a container of Holy Water near the sacristy entrance.

We are reminded of the following advice from the Center for Disease Control to help prevent the spread of the Coronavirus, both in church and at home:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If no soap and water are available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.

## Lenten Regulations

Each year the holy season of Lent provides us with a special time of grace and spiritual renewal so that we may become better instruments in sharing the Gospel message. All members of the Christian faithful in their own way are bound to do penance in virtue of divine law.

The faithful are encouraged during Lent to attend daily Mass, receive Holy Communion, participate in penance services, and receive sacramental absolution. We are also encouraged to take part in public and private exercises of piety, give generously to works of religion and charity, perform acts of kindness toward the sick, aged, and the poor, to practice voluntary self-denial, especially regarding food, drink and worldly amusements, and to pray more fervently, particularly for the intentions of the Holy Father.

*What does 90 mean to you?*

## PRAYER

- 90 minutes of added prayer per day or week
- 90 minutes of adoration (Monday evenings and Holy Thursday)
- pray for 90 people (even if it's one sentence!)
- journal 90 words of reflection on a prayer, scripture or other inspiration
- read 90 chapters of the Bible (89 chapters in the Gospels, only 2 per day!)
- read 90 Psalms
- make a list of 90 things you are grateful for
- make a list of 90 people you are grateful for
- pray 90 beads of the rosary (only 2 rosaries!)
- 90 seconds of conversation per day with God
- read 90 pages of a spiritual book
- listen to 90 minutes of worship music

## FASTING

- 90 minutes of no electronics in the house
- 90 minutes of silence in the house
- limit electronics or media to 90 minutes per day or week
- fast from inactivity by adding 90 minutes of exercise per week
- spend 90 minutes outside with nature instead of indoors
- replace 90 minutes or miles of your commute with walking or biking
- donate or recycle 90 items you don't need anymore
- give up 90 of something (2 per day) to break a habit (cigarettes, drinks, snacks, etc.)
- skip \$90 of splurges
- listen to someone for 90 seconds without talking
- wait 90 seconds before saying or posting something unkind




## San Pedro Calungsod Novena

All are invited to participate in the Filipino-American Community Association's annual Lenten Novena to St. Pedro Calungsod. St. Calungsod was a young Roman Catholic Filipino migrant, sacristan and missionary catechist who, along with the Spanish Jesuit missionary Diego Luis de San Vitores, suffered religious persecution and martyrdom in Guam for their missionary work in 1672. While in Guam, Calungsod preached Christianity to the Chamorro people through catechism, while baptizing infants, children and adults at the risk and expense of being persecuted and eventually murdered. Through Calungsod and San Vitores' missionary efforts, many native Chamorros converted to Roman Catholicism. Calungsod was formally beatified on March 5, 2000 by St. John Paul II and was officially canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on October 21, 2012.

## Stewardship in Lent - For Others

We talk about the three traditional pillars of Lent: **Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving.** Let's look at how those last two can work together for our Lenten preparation.

If we define "fasting" broadly to mean "doing without" and "almsgiving" to mean stewardship, then our opportunities for a good Lent become clearer.

**What we eliminate from our daily lives can become the foundation for what we give others. When we simplify our lives we can enhance our giving.**

What if when we bought an item of new clothing we had a practice of giving away two good used items? What if when we simplify our daily diets through traditional fasting we then increased our giving of money or food to others? What if when we decreased our spending on less essential matters we then increased our giving to our parish, where it can be used to help our fellow parishioners, our neighbors who might need our help at this time of year?

All of us are blessed with a certain amount of financial or other types of resources, to be used in a prayerful and careful way as a gift from God.

*What better way to live our lives than in focusing on the essentials of our lives and in devoting our less essential assets to others?*

## The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated at 1:30pm two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A baptismal preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

## The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

## Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.


