# FROM FATHER SIMON



In November of 2005, Nike unveiled a 110-foot high by 212-foot wide banner in Cleveland with the slogan ‘we are all witnesses.’ The banner was an obvious tribute to the power and athleticism of the then young basketball phenom, Lebron James.

‘We are all witnesses’ was Peter’s bold proclamation on that first Pentecost about two thousand years ago. To those gathered to listen to a few frightened men who were just driven out of hiding, Peter declared ‘God raised this Jesus; of this we are all witnesses’ (Acts 2:32). What did Peter, the disciples and the women witness on that Easter morning and subsequently?

Witnesses have testified to what they experienced on the first Easter morning. Some women come in a group on Sunday, at dawn, intent on anointing the Lord’s body, properly settling it for decent burial, washing the lifeless limbs and wrapping it together with the spices which they had prepared. Not a pleasant task, but a fitting closure for a person whom these women followed while he was alive.

They are caught by surprise. The huge heavy stone rolled from the mouth of the burial chamber. They approach the tomb with caution and hesitating steps. One of them, hand on the tomb ready to flee, peers into the gloomy interior. No one there! One of them steps into this tiny space and others follow. It’s empty, vacant. Their mouths form large o’s. Suddenly blinking, they witness two men in dazzling white clothes standing beside them. Terror seizes the women. These men say, ‘He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, when he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again.’ Then they remembered his words.

The women run to the upper room where Peter, John, and the others are hiding from the authorities and tell the gaping Apostles what they have seen and experienced. Peter and John must see it for themselves so they run to the tomb and stoop and look in. The body of Jesus is not there - the tomb is vacant. They linger, repeatedly gaze around the tiny rock-hued cave. Amazement ties their tongues. For the next forty days, Jesus comes back into their lives several times through closed doors and sometimes walking on water. He also met the women as they fled from the tomb and says to them ‘Do not fear, go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee, there they will see me’ (Mt 28:10).

Galilee was the place where it all began, the calling of the twelve, the healings, exorcisms, resuscitations, the multiplication of loaves and fishes and calming the storm. The disciples now begin to see the whole ministry, life, passion and death in the light of the resurrection. They put into writing their experience with Jesus from this perspective and we who read it two thousand years later have the benefit of knowing how the story ends before we even start. The disciples

had to live through disappointment, fear, misunderstanding and uncertainty to learn that the ‘living one’ was their Savior and Lord. They tell us their story of coming to believe – it is their story of faith.

We are all now in a situation where fear and uncertainty has taken control of our lives. We are trying to find a sense of the ‘new normal’ in our lives. The coronavirus is shaping how we live, relate and respond to life and its challenges. We listen to the news, to stories of helplessness and heroism, selfishness and altruism, everyone has a story to tell. How will we tell our story? Will it be shaped by Easter and our faith? What will our story be, for ‘we are all witnesses!’

- To make a Sunday donation send a text with the keyword "sundayqas" followed by an amount (e.g., to make a \$100 donation to Sunday collections, text: **sundayqas 100**). To make an Easter donation text "easter" followed by the amount. Leave a space between the keyword and the amount.
- If you do not have a GiveCentral account, you may still text the same way to the same number which will then return a link that will allow you to enter your contact and payment information for your donation.

At this time, donations may only be made to Sunday and Easter using Text to Give.

pain, with steadfast faith.


You, Salvation of the Roman People,

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

If there is such a thing as a Catholic “trademark” it is the sign of the cross, first traced on the senses of catechumens as they begin the journey to baptism, or on the forehead of an infant who is brought to the doors of the church at baptism.

As early as the third century, Christians were tracing the sign of the cross on their bodies. At first, the cross was traced on the forehead during times of prayer and daily occupations. We use a similar small cross today as we trace the cross over on the forehead, lips, and heart at the Gospel during Mass. Much later, the full-body sign traced from forehead to heart to shoulders took shape, perhaps copying the priest’s gesture of blessing with the consecrated host during Mass. Today, this superb baptismal gift is a sign of belonging to Christ and the community, a way of focusing our attention, of asking for God’s blessing, of tracing on our shoulders a willingness to find meaning in life’s burdens. In the sign of the cross, we have an ever-available means of expressing gratitude for our baptism.

## The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated at 1:30pm two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A baptismal preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

## The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

## Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.

**SEEDS OF FAITH** - There is a brevity, a certain terseness, in the scripture readings for Easter Sunday. Peter's speech in Acts is built of direct, pointed sentences. Paul's letters are based on straightforward creed-like statements. Even the Gospel story only briefly recounts what will turn out to be one of the most remarkable events in human history—the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. Advertising agents call these encapsulated points of information “bullet points.” Scripture scholars call them kerygmata, or “kernels” of our faith. Actually, “kernels” or “seeds” are good terms for these statements, since throughout the Easter season, we will hear in the Acts of the Apostles, the Letters of Paul, and the Gospel accounts of the days following the Resurrection exactly how these kerygmata began to flower, how they continued to grow through the life of the early church. May these Easter “seeds” of faith serve a similar purpose for us, too, so that the life of the Risen Christ will flourish in us and through our witness in the coming days. Copyright © J. S. Paluch




