

FROM FATHER SIMON



Last September, on my seventh trip to the Holy Land, I finally got to see the church in Emmaus which marks the place that recounts today's Gospel passage. This passage is special to me and it means more to me today, given the current situation in which we find ourselves.

It begs to be recognized as a story about our lives, and it is a story with which we are familiar. It is a story of shattering and restoration. If our life has ever been shattered then this is our story. If our life has ever been restored then this is our story. And if we've ever been in that in-between place, between shattering and restoration, then this is our story.

The two disciples are leaving Jerusalem. They walked along, heart-broken, grief-stricken and traumatized by the recent events involving Jesus. He was the one in whom they had such faith, the miracle worker, the wonder teacher, the one they thought would conquer Israel's enemies and set her free. Yet, he was crucified.

"We were hoping..." they explained. Now their hopes were shattered, their dreams dashed. All seemed utterly lost. And Jesus quietly joins them, patiently listens and explains things to them. The two disciples were so caught up with sadness, blinded by grief, consumed by disappointment, that they failed to recognize Jesus. However, there was comfort in the stranger's words and a feeling that their spirits were lifted up, so much so that they invited the stranger to stay with them. When he sat down to dinner with them and broke bread, they recognized him. Immediately he was gone from their sight but not from their presence.

Like the disciples of Emmaus, we too can lose heart, suffer times of trauma and experience grief, such that when life seems hopeless, we hardly know what to do, where to go. We hope that we will find a cure, that death would not come, that a disaster would be averted. In all of this, Jesus is at our side at every moment of our lives. Often, though, we do not realize his presence, especially in those darker moments. His presence is with us in the Word that is spoken to us and in the Eucharist that we share.

With the reality of what we are facing in our lives, what others are facing around us, and what our world is facing together, the question asked by many is how can we continue to have hope? I invite you to join the parish community for an online retreat titled "Making Hope Real" on Tuesday April 28, from 5:30 to 8:30pm. The retreat will be held via Zoom. Please register in advance at bit.ly/qasretreat so that we can get you the Zoom link. Stay safe and healthy.



FIGHTING DOMESTIC VIOLENCE DURING THE COVID-19 CRISIS



DV hotline calls have increased. Check on those who may need help during this crisis. Experience and data teach us that financial crises, home confinement and prolonged stress exacerbate the frequency and intensity of domestic violence. It is no surprise that the Covid-19

pandemic has made life more dangerous for many already at risk in our country. The Illinois Domestic Violence Hotline reports that calls for help have increased 50% in March, from 60 to 90 a day. Some victims were about to leave their abuser, but now the abuser is home all the time, and they have less opportunity to free themselves. Some are in counseling, and now in-person services are unavailable. Some abusers are more angry by loss of work or home quarantine and thus more threatening to their partners.

If you know or suspect someone is a victim, please check on them! If they are in immediate need, help them call 911. Victims, as well as concerned family members, friends or neighbors can call the National DV Hotline at 1-800-799-7233. The Illinois Domestic Violence Hotline, 877-863-6338 can also be called, as well as any other reputable DV resource to help victims connect with support and services.

TEXT TO GIVE

- If you currently have an active GiveCentral account, you may use the cell phone registered to your account to give by text.
- The phone number to give by text is 773-661-4683.
- To make a Sunday donation send a text with the keyword “*sundayqas*” followed by an amount (**e.g., to make a \$100 donation to Sunday collections, text: sundayqas 100**). To make an Easter donation text “easter” followed by the amount. Leave a space between the keyword and the amount.
- If you do not have a GiveCentral account, you may still text the same way to the same number which will then return a link that will allow you to enter your contact and payment information for your donation.

At this time, donations may only be made to Sunday and Easter using Text to Give.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

“Mystagogy,” reflection on the Easter mysteries, is the chief task of these great fifty days, a “pentecost,” in other words, of grace and renewal. Every Sunday we have accounts of resurrection appearances of the Lord, and sketches of the earliest efforts at being church.

Lent is described as a journey to the font, and Easter may be described in similar terms, since at the very beginning an angel tells the apostles that the Risen Lord “has gone before you into Galilee.” Galilee, of course, was the place where Jesus did his finest work, his preaching, his healing, his gathering the lost and the marginalized to the table. At Easter, we hurry to catch up, putting our renewed baptismal promises to work in our own personal “Galilees”, our little “worlds” waiting for a word of grace, a healing, an act of pardon, an invitation to share a meal. The water often splashed on our Sunday assemblies in Eastertide reminds us that these are the golden, shining days of grace, days to nurture the heart, to speak to one another about things that really matter.

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated at 1:30pm two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A baptismal preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.






