After she made breakfast, packed our lunches and saw us off to school and my dad off to work, she would sit down with the newspaper, coffee and breakfast and relax a bit. The time when we were at school was 'her time'. I guess most mothers today cannot afford 'mom time' with work, keeping up with children's e-learning, preparing endless snacks and other chores. They have to adjust their needs and schedules and adapt quickly to accommodate the children's ever-changing needs. Moms, hats off to you. You deserve this day and we owe it to you.

This Mother's Day let us honor and remember all the relationships we have with the women in our lives who are important to us, both young and old, alive and dead. We can reflect upon and celebrate mothers, stepmothers, grandmothers, aunts, sisters, wives, girlfriends, friends, colleagues, mentors, daughters, nieces and granddaughters. Happy Mother's Day!

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER SIMON REGARDING THE RE-OPENING OF THE BASILICA

Dear Parishioners,

Many of you have seen or heard about the Governor's amended stay-at-home order, which now will classify "the free exercise of religion" as an essential activity, provided that gatherings are limited to 10 persons and that current social distancing, face coverings and other health measures continue to be observed.

While we continue to pray that someday our parish will be reunited in each other's presence, at Mass, for the reception of the sacraments, and simply for private prayer in our Basilica, there is great uncertainty regarding precisely how the amended order will affect us at this time. For now, we are still unable to change our current closure.

We are following this subject closely, as is the Archdiocese of Chicago, and we will be guided by the Archdiocese as the situation becomes clearer and our questions are answered.

My blessings to all, and my heartfelt gratitude to all who continue to support our parish community through their prayers, good wishes and financial contributions at this difficult time.

FIGHTING DOMESTIC VIOLENCE DURING THE COVID-19 CRISIS



DV hotline calls have increased. Check on those who may need help during this crisis. Experience and data tell us that financial crises, home confinement and prolonged stress exacerbate the frequency and intensity of domestic violence. It is no surprise that the Covid-19

pandemic has made life more dangerous for many already at risk in our country. The Illinois Domestic Violence Hotline reports that calls for help have increased 50% in March, from 60 to 90 a day. Some victims were about to leave their abuser, but now the abuser is home all the time, and they have less opportunity to free themselves. Some are in counseling, and now in-person services are unavailable. Some abusers are more angry by loss of work or home quarantine and thus more threatening to their partners.

If you know or suspect someone is a victim, please check on them! If they are in immediate need, help them call 911. Victims, as well as concerned family members, friends or neighbors can call the National DV Hotline at 1-800-799-7233. The Illinois Domestic Violence Hotline, 877-863-6338 can also be called, as well as any other reputable DV resource to help victims connect with support and services.



A CALL TO CARE FOR CREATION



 - To make a Sunday donation send a text with the keyword “*sundayqas*” followed by an amount (e.g., to **make a \$100 donation to Sunday collections, text: *sundayqas 100***). To make an Easter donation text “easter” followed by the amount. Leave a space between the keyword and the amount.
 - If you do not have a GiveCentral account, you may still text the same way to the same number which will then return a link that will allow you to enter your contact and payment information for your donation.
- At this time, donations may only be made to Sunday and Easter using Text to Give.

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated at 1:30pm two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A baptismal preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.

A PRAYER IN GRATITUDE FOR OUR MOTHERS




