

# FROM FATHER SIMON



Two months ago, none of us imagined that our lives would be so drastically changed. Uncertainty and fear shadows us as we attempt to adjust to new realities. We are unable to do the things we used to – see our loved ones, visit with friends, dine out, invite our child’s friends to sleepovers or watch them at baseball or soccer - as we try to protect ourselves from an enemy that is invisible, deadly and knows no boundaries.

Uncertain of how long this will last and how much more will be demanded of us in terms of patience and accommodations made, some of us are beginning to feel its sting and wonder if it will ever get better or if there is any hope?

In the familiar passage from 1 Cor 13:13, St. Paul reminds us that three things endure forever: faith, hope and love. It is not hard for us to imagine faith. It is manifested in our desire to bring our children to the waters of baptism and celebrate life’s important moments like marriage and death in

the context of our faith. And so it is with love. Love is expressed in a kind word, a silent touch or an action that brings joy, light and life to others. Hope on the other hand is difficult to express or quantify. How do we sustain hope in the midst of everything going on around us?

What keeps the disciples going after the death and resurrection of Jesus? Initially, the disciples experience the risen Jesus appearing to them. This is the same Jesus who, in his risen state, walks, talks and eats with his disciples, who invites them to see and touch him. Yet, the risen Jesus does not seem bound by time and space in the manner of ordinary beings. He appears and disappears and sometimes he is not immediately recognizable.

However, what is recognizable is the manner in which the disciples themselves are empowered by these appearances of the risen Jesus. Their lives are changed from despair and cowardice to faith and courage. Jesus who was crucified is now somehow present to them in a new way. They begin to understand that his death is the source of life, peace and forgiveness for all.

However, the days in which the risen Jesus appears to his disciples, leading them from despair to hope are coming to an end. Jesus tells them he is returning to the Father but, he adds, “I will not leave you orphans.” In particular, he promises them he will send “another advocate” who is “the Spirit of truth.” More than an advocate who may plead our cause, this is the Holy Spirit, counsellor, comforter, enabler, divine lover, who comes from God and leads us to God. It is this Spirit who keeps us in relationship with the risen Jesus — and keeps us faithful to the mission he began.

The work and mission of Jesus continue in the life of the Church and the lives of Christians everywhere. We are constantly being called and sent to transform the world we live in. We do this by strengthening our personal relationship with Jesus, keeping our faith alive and being a sign of God’s love through our words and actions. It is faith and love that keep hope alive. It is my fervent desire, that as we approach the great feast of Pentecost, we will be once again empowered by the Spirit and be a beacon of hope to our battered world. Thank you for your faith and love that you show to one another.

Students wanting to participate in the sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation must attend a minimum of two years of Religious Education as per the archdiocesan requirement. First Reconciliation and Communion preparation begins at 1st grade. Confirmation preparation begins at 7th grade.

## FIGHTING DOMESTIC VIOLENCE DURING THE COVID-19 CRISIS



DV hotline calls have increased. Check on those who may need help during this crisis. Experience and data tell us that financial crises, home confinement and prolonged stress exacerbate the frequency and intensity of domestic violence. It is no surprise that the Covid-19

pandemic has made life more dangerous for many already at risk in our country. The Illinois Domestic Violence Hotline reports that calls for help have increased 50% in March, from 60 to 90 a day. Some victims were about to leave their abuser, but now the abuser is home all the time, and they have less opportunity to free themselves. Some are in counseling, but now in-person services are unavailable. Some abusers are more angry by loss of work or home quarantine and thus more threatening to their partners.

If you know or suspect someone is a victim, please check on them! If they are in immediate need, help them call 911. Victims, as well as concerned family members, friends or neighbors can call the National DV Hotline at 1-800-799-7233. The Illinois Domestic Violence Hotline, 877-863-6338 can also be called, as well as any other reputable DV resource to help victims connect with support and services.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Five years ago, Pope Francis issued the groundbreaking encyclical *Laudato Si'*. "I urgently appeal," he wrote, "...for a new dialogue about how we are shaping the future of our planet. We need a conversation which includes everyone, since the environmental challenge we are undergoing, and its human roots, concern and affect us all." These words continue to resonate during the COVID-19 pandemic, as the deep interconnectedness of the relationship between our society and our common home continues to be emphasized.

Later this month, during the week of May 16-24, Catholic communities throughout the Archdiocese of Chicago are invited to participate in "*Laudato Si' Week*" to marks its fifth anniversary. Pastors are encouraged to preach on the importance of caring for God's creation and promoting an integral ecology and include intentions for the healing and restoration of our common home. I also encourage all the faithful to contact their Congressional representatives in support of H.R. 763, the Energy Innovation and Carbon Dividend Act, a bipartisan piece of legislation aimed at alleviating climate change by reducing national carbon emissions. This legislation has been approved by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops and the Catholic Climate Covenant.

Our Office of Human Dignity and Solidarity has provided resources and learning opportunities online at [www.archchicago.org/creation](http://www.archchicago.org/creation) to help your family and community care for our common home during Laudato Si' Week and beyond. You, your families and our common home are certainly in my prayers during this unprecedented time.



## The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated at 1:30pm two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A baptismal preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

## The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

## Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.




