

## FROM FATHER SIMON



Finally...after nearly three months we are ready to gather once again in the basilica to celebrate the sacraments, especially the Eucharist. This could not have happened at a better time than this weekend. This weekend we celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi. This is the last Sunday in the long festal period of the liturgical year. It began with Ash Wednesday, reached a pinnacle at Easter and continued through to Pentecost. Next Sunday, we return to Ordinary Time in the Church. This feast of Corpus Christi offers us a moment in which to look back on it all, and to give thanks for it all, especially for the opportunity to gather once again in our spiritual home.

Our time apart has been difficult, even with the modern aids of weekly video Masses, emailed newsletters, our website, and our social media. There is

simply no replacement to being physically present in this sacred space, together with our fellow parishioners, in shared worship.

There are some simple common-sense guidelines we will now follow, which are based on Archdiocesan rules and the design of our basilica. We seek the personal safety of everyone attending Mass, while preserving respect for our sacred liturgies.

#### Whether and when to attend Mass again

The obligation to attend weekly Mass is still suspended for now, so do not be concerned if you are still unable to attend, especially if you have health or mobility issues or are over 65.

**Do not attend Mass** if you have a temperature or feel uncomfortable in any way. We will be here for you when you are feeling better. Be good to yourself and take care for the health of others.

#### Weekday Masses will resume at the same times as before, beginning:

Friday, June 12, 2020, at 6:30 am and 8:30 am

## Weekend Masses will be spaced farther apart than before to allow for cleaning and disinfecting, beginning:

Saturday, June 13 at 5:00 pm, and Sunday, June 14 at 7:00 am, 9:00 am, 11:00 am and 1:00 pm

#### What to know before Mass

Reservations are required for each household. Our capacity is limited by the number of pews and the need to maintain social distancing between "households." To ensure fairness and efficient seating this will require parishioners to pre-register for Mass. We will use a very common web-based program called *SignUpGenius* which will allow households to register their attendance (any number between one and fourpersons per household). Registration for weekend Masses will open up the Wednesday before. You will be able to register for weekday Masses up to one week in advance. You can access *SignUpGenius* through a link on the parish website or on social media. The password to make reservations for weekend Masses will be emailed to all parishioners each week. Please do not share the password with others. If you do not have internet access or if you have special seating needs, please call the rectory during normal business hours for assistance.

What is a household? A household is a maximum of 4 persons who have been living in the same residence without the need for social distancing or masking among themselves. A household can consist of 1, 2, 3, or 4 persons. We request that you observe a limit of one reservation of up to 4 people for Mass, in order to allow ample opportunity for all households to attend.

**Spacing within the basilica.** We will use every pew for seating and will seat households alternating at the far left or far right sides of each pew. In this configuration every member of a household will be seated no less than 6 feet from a member of an adjoining household. For example, if you are sitting at the far left of a pew the closest households will be two pews directly in front of you or two pews directly behind you, or one pew diagonally ahead to your right or one pew diagonally behind to your right. We will not use the pews by the side altars. The Mother's Chapel is closed to any activity for the foreseeable future.

#### What to do when you arrive for Mass

Line up at the porte cochere. Entrance to the basilica will be limited to the door under the porte cochere (the covered entrance at the northwest corner of the basilica). The line will begin at the door and extend to the south along the driveway and along Keene Avenue. Please maintain social distancing between households. There will be cones or other markers on the ground to assist in that regard.

Face covering is required. Put your mask on when you leave your car before Mass and leave it on until you are back in your car after Mass.

**Keeping surfaces disinfected.** The doors will be kept open so you will not have to touch handles. Please bring your own hand sanitizer, but do not bring or use any product containing bleach or other damaging solvents on the wood, marble, metal or other basilica surfaces. Please avoid touching surfaces with your hands as much as possible.

#### What to know about Mass

Registered households will be escorted to their seats. An usher will check the name of your household against the list of registrations. Beginning 15 minutes before Mass your household will be led to the first available seats, starting at the front of the basilica. The size of your household will not affect the location of your seating. Please do not ask for alternate seating.

**If you do not have a reservation.** An usher will direct you to another stand-by line and your household will be given a seat depending on whether one is available. Households cannot be combined. For example, a household with 2 people cannot be seated with another unrelated household with 2 people.

**No worship aids in the pews.** All songbooks and other liturgical material have been removed. We know you have memorized the words to the Gloria and Creed.

**Sign of peace is still suspended.** As was the case back in March in the last few weeks before the closing, all physical contact with others is to be avoided.

Communion. An usher will release the pews for Communion. Communicants will form a single file line in the middle of the main aisle. Please use your own hand sanitizer before receiving Communion. While still wearing your mask go to the priest or extraordinary minister at the left or right side of the aisle depending on where you are sitting and receive the Holy Eucharist in your hand. Holy Communion will only be given in the hand and not on the tongue, per the Cardinal's mandate. After accepting the Eucharist in your hand, move to the marked spot @ 12 feet away, remove your mask and accept the Eucharist in your mouth. Then put your mask back on. Do not leave the basilica after Communion, but rather return to your pew down the side aisles.

Leave beginning with the front pews and exit through the front doors. At the end of Mass, the ushers will direct you to leave from the front of the basilica beginning from the front pew. Both front doors will be propped open for exits. Baskets will be available on the way out to gratefully accept your offertory envelopes.

I know that these guidelines may seem awkward at first. New procedures may take some time to seem comfortable. It is my fervent hope that advances in medical treatment, such as vaccines, will allow us to loosen these restrictions when it is safe. In the meantime, please bear with us and with your fellow worshipers as we focus again on what is truly important – our opportunity to worship together as a faith community.

### RELIGIOUS EDUCATION News

A Special THANK YOU to all the Religious Education families, catechists and volunteers. This year would not have ended so smoothly had it not been for the dedication of all those involved in the program. In March, when the schools closed, and the stay at home order went into place, Religious Education classes had to switch to a remote platform. In addition to being their homeschool teacher, parents now acted as their child's catechist. Each week parents were provided a teaching guide and additional videos and activities to help walk their child through their remaining lesson and chapters.

Our amazing catechists continued to stay connected to their students as well. Some sent weekly emails, others made personalized video messages and lessons for their classes, others even sent them cards in the mail! It was great to see how much our volunteer catechists cared about their students and their families!

As we thought about how much more screen-time our children were getting during this time, we used Holy Week to encourage families to do crafts, activities, and even create snacks and food based around each day of Holy Week. Families had the opportunity to walk through Holy Week at home, away from the computer screen, spending time together while learning more about our faith.

We were also impressed by the dedication of our confirmation students. The 7th and 8th grade Religious Education students were given weekly lessons, instructing them what parts of their text to read, providing additional information on each subject through articles and short videos. After each lesson they completed an assessment of the

very seriously, as was reflected in their answers. We are proud to see so many young people motivated and committed to their faith. We look forward to celebrating your confirmation with you all soon!

Registration is open for the fall. We are putting into place more clear guidelines for how elearning will be implemented if needed, but we are hopeful that we can all return to the classrooms. Registration for Religious Education 2020-2021 is now open!

#### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

We owe today's beautiful feast to a valiant woman who suffered a great deal to establish a feast out of her love for the Eucharist. Juliana was a nun in Belgium in the thirteenth century. She served in a hospital for lepers. She became convinced through her prayer that the liturgical year was incomplete because it had no feast for the Eucharist. Her efforts were not welcome, and a supervising priest sought to punish her for promoting a feast that "nobody wanted." He even had her accused of financial mismanagement and banished her from her convent.

Shortly after she was exiled, the bishop approved the feast. It quickly spread through Europe. In those days, people very seldom received Holy Communion, and so the processions through the streets with the eucharistic bread not only led to an awareness of Christ's hunger to be with us, but prepared the way for a deeper desire to receive Christ's Body and Blood in more frequent Communion. The feast grew rapidly, but Juliana disappeared into poverty and a hidden life. She ended her days as an "anchoress," a woman living in seclusion in a room attached to a parish church. Imagine her delight at seeing us gathered at the table of the Lord on this day, aware of Christ's presence in our midst, sharing fully in Christ's Body and Blood. Our celebration today invests her struggle and sorrows with dignity and meaning.

#### The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated at 1:30pm two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A baptismal preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

#### The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

#### Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.




