

FROM FATHER SIMON



If anything, the one thing this pandemic has given most of us is *time*. Some of us have used the time to re-organize the attic or the garage, get rid of the old, be surprised by the hidden treasures we never knew we had or find things that brought back memories, many pleasant and some not so pleasant. We have learned that not all hidden things are pleasant surprises.

The hidden presence of COVID-19 has affected us on physical, emotional, spiritual and financial levels. On the other hand, it has brought to the fore newfound values, newfound fellow travelers, inner strength, hope and resilience, teaching us what we are made of. Nature, beauty, music, reading, resting and conversing have come to life in a wholly different way. The wave of kindness, generosity, respect and care flows through our society. At their peril, so many do what is right, fulfilling the necessary work that feeds and heals so many.

Everything has been reduced to what is truly necessary and what is truly good. That is the message of this week's gospel. The parables of the hidden treasures is about us – what we treasure and how we come to treasure. It is about re-calculating in our lives what say we value and the things we spend most of our time valuing. These may not necessarily be the same.

There are 'hidden treasures' here at QAS that I want to throw some light on. No, I haven't found a valuable piece of art, or a large sum stashed away in an account nor a secret blueprint to fix the building issues here – NO. The maintenance staff of QAS – Ralph, Bobby, Eric, Jonathan, Ken and Victor make sure our facilities are clean, safe and worthy of your presence. I am especially grateful for the extra effort they are putting in at this unusual time. Our business manager Jerry Farrell, from his corner office in the basement, coordinates all of our workforce and plans and keeps track of how we as 'staff' are responsible stewards of the resources entrusted to us. This pandemic and the reopening plans for both the school and parish have exponentially increased our work load and I am grateful to all of my staff for 'stepping up' to give you the best we can. If you happen to see them or any of the staff, please let them know how much you appreciate them.

Another revelation has been the number of volunteers who have come forward to help the resumption of liturgical services in the basilica. 

SOCIAL JUSTICE MINISTRY: DOMESTIC VIOLENCE DURING COVID-19

What do you do when “Stay At Home” is not safe?
Domestic violence surges during pandemic COVID-19 have made life more dangerous for many already at risk. Financial crises, home confinement and pro-

longed stress have increased the frequency and intensity of domestic violence. The Illinois Domestic Violence Hotline has reported that calls for help increased 50%. Nationwide Domestic Violence 911 emergency calls are estimated to have increased 10%-30%. Those causing harm to their partners are under greater stress during the pandemic. Their behavior of power and control is exacerbated because social contacts and movement of both spouses are severely restricted. Victims lack freedom to talk to friends or confidants. Sadly, while children are also at increased risk, statistics of child abuse reflect that children who are out of school have less opportunity to seek help.

If you know or suspect someone is a victim, please check on them! If they are in immediate need, help them call 911 or the National Domestic Violence 24-Hour Hotline at 800-799-7233 (800-799-SAFE) or visit thehotline.org.

SIGNING UP FOR MASS

QUEEN OF ALL SAINTS

1 PARISH WEBSITE

Go onto the parish website and click on “Mass Reservation.” Then click on signup labeled “here.” Sign ups for the weekend and following week are available every Wednesday.

2 PASSWORD

To sign up for a weekend Mass you will need to use a password. This password will be emailed every Wednesday before the weekend Masses. There is no password required for weekday Masses.

3 CHOOSING A MASS TIME

Look through the Mass times and check “sign up” under the Mass time you want to attend then select “submit and sign up” at the bottom of the page.

4 MAKING A RESERVATION

To attend the Mass, make one reservation (Quantity = 1) and in the white box, indicate the total number of people in your household that are attending. Please do not include people living outside of your household in your reservation.

Add your first, last name and email in the designated boxes and then click the “sign up now.”

5 CONGRATULATIONS

You have officially signed up to attend Mass. You will receive a reminder email two days before the date of your reservation.

DRIVE-IN MASS

We are happy to announce that our Sunday 7 am Mass is scheduled as a “drive-in” Mass in our parking lot, weather and other logistics permitting. **This Mass has limited capacity and is especially designed for the more vulnerable members of our parish who are not comfortable attending Mass in the basilica due to age, mobility, immune status or other health issues.** Some tips to efficiently ensure the health of our fellow parishioners:

- Make a reservation for your car (one reservation per household) for the 7 am Sunday Mass. The on-line link to register will be sent on Wednesday. Everyone who attends this Mass must arrive in a car and remain inside their car for the duration of the Mass.
- The parking lot will open at 6:30 am and will close at 7:05 am so that our celebration will not be disturbed by those arriving late.
- All cars will be parked facing west, and a temporary altar (**marked below in blue**) will be set at the west end of the parking lot on a short platform.
- Cars will be parked socially distant, similar to how the pews in the church are arranged - for each row, cars are to be parked in every other spot in the row, diagonally to the car in front of you (**marked below in red**).
- All cars are to enter the parking lot from the north end at Sauganash and Lemont Avenues (**marked below in green**). All cars are to exit the parking lot from the south end on to Keene (**marked below in purple**).
- The Mass will be broadcast on a low-power FM frequency which you can hear on your car radio. The frequency of our broadcast will be posted in the parking lot.
- Communion will be distributed through your open car window. Please use your own hand sanitizer before receiving Communion.
- Please do not park on Keene or Sauganash Avenues. It is unlikely that our radio transmission will reach you and Communion will not be distributed there.

We expect Mass to take less than 45 minutes.

STEWARDSHIP OUR RESPONSE TO THREE CRISES

Regular readers of this page know we were in the fortunate position to be able to borrow from our long-term savings accounts (our endowments) to fund two unforeseen expenses:

- repairs to our basilica ceiling
- repairs to our basilica bell tower.

We are now faced with a third unexpected event, not an expense item but a disruption to our regular collections caused by the COVID-19 closure of the basilica.

There are a number of ways in which we can be a part of the effort to help, **the most obvious of which is simply to increase our regular Sunday offertory collection.** This is our most important source of ongoing support, and the excess over our budgeted needs will be deposited in our parish endowments.

But there are **other possibly less obvious ways** by which our parishioners can help our parish, once they have made their contribution to our parish operations through their Sunday offertory. **These gifts will be made directly to our endowments:**

- ***The Blue Envelope*** included in your bi-monthly envelope mailing.
- ***A check*** sent to the rectory made out to Queen of All Saints Parish, with a notation earmarking it for direct deposit to parish endowments.
- ***A planned giving option***, such as a gift of appreciated securities, a Qualified Charitable Distribution from your IRA if you are at least 70 1/2 years old, or by including our parish in your estate planning. (Contact our business office for more information.)

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated on Saturdays. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A baptismal preparation class for the parents is required. Please contact the rectory for further details. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
