

FROM FATHER SIMON



Each October the Church in the United States celebrates Respect Life Month, and the first Sunday of October is observed as Respect Life Sunday. As Catholics, we are called to cherish, defend and protect those who are most vulnerable, from the beginning of life to its end, and at every point in between. During the month of October, the Church asks us to reflect more deeply on the dignity of every human life. Let us join Catholics nationwide in celebrating the kickoff of Respect Life Month. Below is a reflection on this year's theme, "Live the Gospel of Life," which takes its cue from the encyclical of Pope St. John Paul II, 'Evangelium vitae.'

Twenty-five years ago, Pope St. John Paul II wrote that the Gospel of life is at the *heart* of Jesus' saving message to the world (*Evangelium vitae* 1). In taking on human flesh, dwelling among us, and sacrificing his very life for our redemption, Christ reveals the profound dignity of *every* human person. This God-given dignity does not change with our stage of life, abilities, level of independence, or any other varying circumstance.

Rather, it is rooted in the permanent fact that each of us is made in the image and likeness of God, created to share in the very life of God himself. The human person is a "manifestation of God in the world, a sign of his presence, a trace of his glory" (EV 34). And we must reflect this truth in how we act and how we treat one another.

The truth of the Gospel of life is at the foundation of who we are as followers of Christ. In his earthly life, Jesus provided the perfect model for how we are to love our neighbor and live out the Gospel call: "Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me" (Mt. 25:40).

Jesus calls each of us to "care for the other as a person for whom God has made us responsible" (EV 87). The Gospel of life is intrinsic to the whole Christian life and foundational to the decisions we make on a daily basis. For, "the Gospel of God's love for man, the Gospel of the dignity of the person and


the Gospel of life are a *single and indivisible* Gospel" (EV 2, emphasis added).

In his encyclical on the Gospel of life, Pope St. John Paul II recognizes the full range of threats against human life, from poverty and malnutrition to murder and war. He places particular emphasis, however, on threats to life at its beginning and end—precisely when it is most in need of protection. In modern times, children in their mothers' wombs and those approaching the end of their lives are certainly among the "least of these" in our world's estimation. Practices such as abortion and assisted suicide tragically reject the truth that human life is always to be cherished and defended with loving concern.

As the Church celebrates the 25th anniversary of Pope St. John Paul II's prophetic encyclical, let us reflect on how we personally live out the Gospel: *Do I talk about and act towards others as I would talk about and treat Jesus himself? Do I inform myself of the Church's teachings and engage in the civic arena as first a follower of Christ? Do I support and advocate for laws and policies that protect and defend human life? Do I help pregnant and parenting mothers in need? Am I ready to support a loved one nearing death?*

Through the intercession of Our Lady of Guadalupe, may Our Lord grant us the grace to truly and courageously live his Gospel of life.




IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR MASS ATTENDEES

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

As we head into Fall, we can look back at our construction progress with a sense of accomplishment.

Our majestic bell tower is now completely finished. As you know, we ran into many roadblocks including weather, water issues and problems matching the stone, to name a few. Our contractor BAMR, our consultant from Wiss, Janney, Elstner Associates along with our representative from the Archdiocese were all instrumental in providing us with a finished project that is solid and watertight for years to come.



This summer we were able to remediate the asbestos that needed to be completed before work on the new Parish Center could start. We also finished all the electrical work ahead of schedule so that when we start our final phase this spring of updating the air conditioning for the Lemont building we are ready to go!

Tuckpointing on our buildings is an ongoing problem and we were able to complete work on multiple spots.



We are thankful for past generations who were able to provide and plan for the future of Queen of All Saints. As the current caretakers of the basilica, we can be proud of all the work that we have been able to achieve, thanks to you and your generous donations to our “building campaign.” During these difficult times we are especially grateful for the continued commitment you have shown to your pledges as we move into our final phase.



REAFFIRM that he/she should not stay in an abusive relationship.

PROVIDE phone numbers and website addresses for help services and local shelters.

BE SUPPORTIVE. LISTEN.
Keep an open mind.

HELP develop a safety plan.

ENCOURAGE him/her to spend time with family and friends outside of the relationship.

SUGGEST opening a checking or savings account if possible.



REMEMBER THAT YOU CANNOT "RESCUE" A VICTIM; HE/SHE HAS TO MAKE OWN CHOICES.
Whether or not the victim ends the relationship, continue to be supportive.

A 4TH QUARTER THOUGHT DIRECT CONTRIBUTIONS FROM YOUR IRA

If you are 70½ or older and have an IRA, you may qualify for a charitable giving opportunity directly from your IRA.

- You are now allowed to make direct transfers from an IRA to Queen of All Saints Parish.
- This is an ideal situation even for those who do not itemize deductions since the withdrawal is not considered taxable income.
- Our parish will receive 100% of your transfer.
- You can transfer up to \$100,000 annually.
- Although the required minimum distribution rule has been temporarily suspended for 2020, remember that for future years this type of transfer can be credited against your RMD.

The tax-free nature of this withdrawal may have a number of other favorable benefits affecting your tax return, depending on your particular situation, such as reduced taxes on Social Security distributions or future Medicare premiums.

New tax deduction for charitable contributions - even if you take the standard deduction.

The new **CARES Act (Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act)** provides a new tax deduction **even for those who do not itemize.**

Starting in 2020, charitable donations can be deducted from your taxable income up to \$300 per person, or \$600 for joint filers.

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the sacrament of baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The sacrament of baptism for infants is celebrated on Saturdays. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A baptismal preparation class for the parents is required. Please contact the rectory for further details. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the anointing of the sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
