



FROM FATHER SIMON



Planning for the holidays this year has not been easy. When the pandemic began earlier this year, we were not anticipating the situation we are currently in, with cases rising all over the country and world. This time of the year is centered around family gatherings, catching up with relatives and friends and observing annual traditions. Most of us are having to make tough decisions as we weigh the risks of celebrating the holidays the way we are used to. We are trying to find or create socially responsible ways of observing the time-honored traditions within our families.

The parable of the talents, which we hear this weekend, is one of three in Matthew's gospel that is part of the end times. It is a parable that captures the essence of what it means to acknowledge our gifts and talents and to place them freely and fully at the service of others. Such generosity with oneself requires the type of risk-taking that is exemplified in the first two servants. Each dared to risk investing all that had been entrusted him by his employer. Neither held back anything even though worldly prudence may have dictated for them to do so. From these risk-taking servants, we learn that all comes to us from God as gift. Therefore, all should be given as gift, without judging the worthiness of the recipient and with full awareness that what we give may be misused, undervalued or even abused. However, one servant was afraid to invest the talent entrusted to him. Unlike that servant, in these times when we are calculating the risks of celebrating the holiday traditions in the only way we know, fear should not impede us from finding creative ways to include those we cannot physically be with during this time. We are all capable of celebrating the holidays in a safe manner.

This holiday season offers us an opportunity to acknowledge the gifts with which we have been blessed, to be grateful for them, to use and share these gifts to better our lives and that of those around us. I invite you to join the parish celebration of Thanksgiving at our 10am Mass on Thanksgiving Day. With limited seating available and mindful that some of us are either vulnerable or uncomfortable being with large crowds, we will livestream the Mass. Sure, it is going to be a busy day with football, appetizers and the thanksgiving meal. Still, we can take the time to be part of the best tradition of the day – giving thanks to God through the Eucharist. I hope you will join us. In the meantime, plan on being safe and let us all be socially responsible.

WHAT IS HAPPENING IN RCIA

Each week the inquirers and RCIA team start our session by breaking open with the gospel passage from Sunday's Mass. Some of the passages have been simple for us to explore, such as the greatest commandment, *you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind... You shall love your neighbor as yourself.* Other passages have been harder to decipher, such as the parable of the wedding banquet. Both passages, whether difficult or straightforward, are meant to challenge us. Following the gospel messages are never supposed to be easy. And like the gospel, the RCIA process does a lot of challenging. Our Catholic faith is beautiful and complex, and it is meant to challenge us daily. As Catholics we are made to listen to the Sunday gospel, be filled spiritually by the Eucharist and go out into the world being the hands and feet of Christ. There is nothing easy about being Christ in the world.



Right now, our inquirers are still in the "period of inquiry." Each of them has answered a call from God to be part of RCIA. This period is so important because all of our inquirers are exploring that call from God to be part of the Catholic Church. The call can be challenging in itself. Which is why our inquirers need you. They need our parish community to support and pray for them.

When emailing or calling us be sure to include the name and the date you are requesting for the Mass intention. Mass intentions are taken only for the morning Masses, Monday - Friday, 6:30 and 8:30am and Saturday, 8:00am. Sunday and Holy Day intentions are not available since they are for the people of Queen of All Saints parish.

Mass intentions are listed in the bulletin for the week in which they occur. However, if they are received after the bulletin is published, they will still be included in the intentions, but not listed in the bulletin.



There is no set fee for a Mass intention, however a donation is greatly appreciated. You may mail in your donation, drop it off at the rectory or donate through GiveCentral.

- Go to qasparish.org and click on the GiveCentral icon on the left side of your screen.
- On the GiveCentral site (shown here to the right), click on “Sunday Offering” or whatever category to which you wish to contribute
- It will take you to “Make A Contribution”
- Enter an amount, choose frequency, if this will be ongoing or custom
- Click Add to my “Gift Basket”
- You will see the message “successfully added”
- Click “Check Out” then continue
- Click either “Complete Profile” or “Give as Guest”
- You will be prompted to enter your name, address and payment option. Please fill in accordingly
- Check “I Accept The User Policy” box
- Click “Confirm Gift”
- You will then see a pop-up box confirming your gift



TEXT TO GIVE

- If you currently have an active GiveCentral account, you may use the cell phone registered to your account to give by text.
- The phone number to give by text is 773-661-4683.
- To make a Sunday donation send a text with the keyword “*sundayqas*” followed by an amount (**e.g., to make a \$100 donation to Sunday collections, text: sundayqas 100**). To make an Easter donation text “easter” followed by the amount. Leave a space between the keyword and the amount.
- If you do not have a GiveCentral account, you may still text the same way to the same number which will then return a link that will allow you to enter your contact and payment information for your donation.

At this time, donations may only be made to Sunday and Easter using Text to Give.

A LOOK BACK AND A HOPEFUL LOOK FORWARD

The COVID-19 pandemic has caused our country's greatest financial challenge since the Great Depression, with particular impact on churches and other charities that rely on voluntary contributions to survive.

At a time like this it is reassuring to hear the words of Monsignor Dolan, who became our pastor in 1934 during the Depression, in his 1950 fundraising message for the gym, cafeteria and rectory projects. His words have a powerful message for us today:

* * * * *

"There was a time, not so very long ago, when a project like our present one would have been far beyond any hope of realization for this parish.

It is only 15 years since Queen of All Saints Parish was housed in a little portable church in a barren stretch of prairie-with a little group of only 43 families.

The physical evidence of our growth is, of course, plain to see. We now have nearly 1,000 families instead of 43. We now have substantial, modern buildings, and we own all the land we shall need for years to come.

But there is something else, something less tangible, though far more real, which is a better measure of Queen of All Saints Parish strength.

In this Parish, year after year, there has been evidence of never-failing determination and courage, far beyond the ordinary levels.

Here, time after time, problems that would stagger most parishes have been met instantly and overcome in a flash.

Whatever the parish has needed in personal effort, in loyal cooperation, or in money, has always been provided spontaneously—without urging.

When we have incurred necessary debts, you have always been impatient to clear them quickly. Having cleared them, you have never hesitated to jump right in and assume new ones. There has, somehow, been a sort of magic about your willingness to work and to give to the great project of building the parish of your dreams."

* * * * *

Our parish went on to complete those projects and then the biggest project of all, the magnificent church building where you received this bulletin. As beneficiaries of this heritage we have a special obligation to maintain and enhance our parish for ourselves and for those who come after us.

Thank you for all you do for our parish!

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the sacrament of baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The sacrament of baptism for infants is celebrated on Saturdays. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A baptismal preparation class for the parents is required. Please contact the rectory for further details. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the anointing of the sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
