

EVENTS AND SCHEDULE FOR THE ADVENT AND CHRISTMAS SEASONS

In a few days many of us will be with our families, maybe in a more subdued way this year, to come together on Thanksgiving Day in thanks and praise for all with which we have been blessed. Then, almost in the blink of an eye, on the weekend immediately following our Thanksgiving celebration, we, as a Church, turn our attention to Advent and Christmas.

While you are putting the finishing touches on your Thanksgiving celebrations, we at QAS are gearing up to celebrate Advent and Christmas with joy and dignity following all the protocols in place during these trying times. The following is a run-down of the major events in place from now through Christmas:

Christmas Mass Schedule: Following the protocols in place for COVID19, we have limited seating availability for the Masses. Reservations are the only way that assures you of a seat during Masses in the basilica. Our Christmas Mass schedule will be the following:

Please note the following for Christmas Masses:

1. Doors open 30 minutes before services and will be closed 10 minutes after the scheduled service begins.
2. You will need a reservation to be in the basilica.
3. Reservations for Christmas Masses will open on December 15. The password to make reservations will be mailed to you soon. Make reservations only for those in your family.
4. If your plans change after you made a reservation, please cancel your reservation, so as to allow others who are waiting to be added to the list.

In addition to the Masses, we will have ‘drive-by’ Holy Communion on Christmas Day from 8 am to 8:30 am for those who are vulnerable and those who are uncomfortable being with large crowds in a closed space. Details will be forthcoming.

OTHER HAPPENINGS DURING THIS SEASON:

Tuesday, December 8 is the **Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception**. Our Mass schedule for this holy day is 6:30 am, 8:30 am, 12 noon* and 7:30 pm. Reservations are required.

Sunday, December 13 @ 6:45 pm* - Every second Sunday in December on **Worldwide Candle Lighting Day**, family and friends gather to remember the children who left this earth too soon. All those who have lost a child are welcome. We prefer you make a reservation. However, walk-ins are welcome.

Tuesday, December 15 after morning Masses – “**Holiday Coffee**” It is a basilica tradition that those who attend the weekday morning Masses are invited to the rectory for coffee and holiday cheer. In light of our current situation, we will continue this tradition albeit a little differently – you can grab a cup of coffee, wave a hello to your fellow parishioners and proceed to your next engagement.

Saturday, December 19, @ 7:00 pm* – Parish celebration of **Simbang Gabi**. Simbang Gabi is a Filipino tradition of celebrating a novena of Advent Masses to heighten our preparation for the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ, and in honor of our Blessed Mother. This year we will not have a reception following the Mass. A reservation to attend Mass is required.

Confessions: Don't forget to prepare yourself for Christmas and avail yourself the opportunity for the sacrament of reconciliation. Confessions are heard on Saturdays after the 8 am Mass and on Monday December 21 from 4 to 5 pm.

Christmas Music: ‘Handel’s Messiah’, another of the Christmas traditions at QAS will be different this year. In line with our COVID guidelines, our cantors will bring together some reflective seasonal music for you to enjoy throughout the Advent and Christmas seasons. This will be made available on the parish website. Watch the bulletin and email for the release date.

New Year's Eve and New Year's Day: January 1 is the **Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God**. Our Mass schedule for this holy day is as follows:

MASS INTENTIONS

To request a Mass intention, you can call us at the rectory at 773-736-6060, or email us at qasoffice@qasparish.org.

When emailing or calling us be sure to include the name of the person and the date you are requesting for the Mass intention. Mass intentions are taken only for the morning Masses, Monday - Friday, 6:30 and 8:30am and Saturday, 8am. Sunday and Holy Day intentions are not available as they are for the people of Queen of All Saints parish.



Mass intentions are listed in the bulletin for the week in which they occur. However, if they are received after the bulletin is published, they will still be included in the intentions, but not listed in the bulletin.

There is no set fee for a Mass intention, however a donation is greatly appreciated. You may mail in your donation, drop it off at the rectory or donate through GiveCentral.

ILLINOIS TAX CREDIT SCHOLARSHIPS



INCREASE STUDENT OPPORTUNITIES

The state program Invest in Kids offers a transformational opportunity for Archdiocese of Chicago Catholic Schools through tax credit scholarships (TCS). Children in our state from low-income families will have access to new scholarships to attend non-public schools. Tax credit scholarships cover up to 100 percent of tuition and fees for students. Scholarship eligibility is based on a family's income. For example, a student could receive a scholarship if his/her family income is less than \$72,900.

LOWER YOUR TAX BILL

Invest in Kids provides Illinois state income tax credits to individuals and corporations that contribute money to an approved Scholarship Granting Organization (SGO). SGOs are independent 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations that award scholarships to eligible students from low-income families. Individuals and corporations may receive a credit for their Illinois state taxes equal to 75 percent of donations to an SGO. Individuals can designate their donation to a school or subset of schools.

INVEST IN KIDS IN THREE EASY STEPS



1. APPLY FOR A TAX CREDIT AT MYTAX.ILLINOIS.GOV

Applicants are required to have a MyTax Illinois account. Visit archchicago.org/tcs for step-by-step instructions for creating an account and applying for the tax credit.



2. DONATE TO AN SGO WITHIN 60 DAYS

Once the application is approved, donate to a Scholarship Granting Organization, such as Empower Illinois or Big Shoulders Fund SGO, within 60 days.



3. DESIGNATE TO CHICAGO CATHOLIC SCHOOLS

During the donation process, donors have the option to donate to a specific Catholic school or the Archdiocese of Chicago Catholic Schools.

WHAT IS HAPPENING IN RCIA

Each week the inquirers and RCIA team start our session by breaking open with the Gospel passage from Sunday's Mass. Some of the passages have been simple for us to explore, such as the greatest commandment, *you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind... You shall love your neighbor as yourself.* Other passages have been harder to decipher, such as the parable of the wedding banquet. Both passages, whether difficult or straightforward, are meant to challenge us. Following the Gospel messages is never supposed to be easy. And like the Gospel, the RCIA process does a lot of challenging. Our Catholic faith is beautiful and complex, and it is meant to challenge us daily. As Catholics we are made to listen to the Sunday Gospel, be filled spiritually by the Eucharist and go out into the world being the hands and feet of Christ. There is nothing easy about being Christ in the world.



SIGNING UP ON GIVECENTRAL

- Go to qasparish.org and click on the GiveCentral icon on the left side of your screen.
- On the GiveCentral site (shown here to the right), click on “Sunday Offering” or whatever category to which you wish to contribute
- It will take you to “Make A Contribution”
- Enter an amount, choose frequency, if this will be ongoing or custom
- Click Add to my “Gift Basket”
- You will see the message “successfully added”
- Click “Check Out” then continue
- Click either “Complete Profile” or “Give as Guest”
- You will be prompted to enter your name, address and payment option. Please fill in accordingly
- Check “I Accept The User Policy” box
- Click “Confirm Gift”
- You will then see a pop-up box confirming your gift



TEXT TO GIVE

- If you currently have an active GiveCentral account, you may use the cell phone registered to your account to give by text.
- The phone number to give by text is 773-661-4683.
- To make a Sunday donation send a text with the keyword “*sundayqas*” followed by an amount (**e.g., to make a \$100 donation to Sunday collections, text: sundayqas 100**). To make an Easter donation text “easter” followed by the amount. Leave a space between the keyword and the amount.
- If you do not have a GiveCentral account, you may still text the same way to the same number which will then return a link that will allow you to enter your contact and payment information for your donation.

At this time, donations may only be made to Sunday and Easter using Text to Give.
